Gandhiji's Fasts - XXI August 15, 1947-A day of fasting and prayer

The decision to partition the nation saddened Gandhiji. There was an exodus of people from one side to the other accompanied by an unprecedented spate of communal violence .People were simply mad. Gandhiji was a worried man. He was anguished by the tales of innocent victims of violence and the problems of people rendered "refugees" in their own motherland. His appeals were unheeded, and sections of both the communities caviled at him as being partial towards the other side.

His speeches from the Bhangi Colony were bearing a depressive note. He confessed to his misgiving that the struggle we carried on for the last 30 years was not non-violent in spirit. He gave a call to observe August 15 in a solemn manner. It was not his intention to have the day set apart for mourning although it was a day of sorrow, not because the British were leaving, but because they were doing so after having the nation torn asunder. There were strong reasons for every Indian to fast and pray and feel humble before God as the times they were born bore the sad witness to bear witness to brother fighting brother.

Calcutta was literally in flames, all engineered and encouraged by the then Chief Minister of Bengal Province, Suharwardy. Murder, rape, arson, loot, forcible conversions and forced marriages were the order of the day. There was aggressive retaliation from the other side. Only then Suharwardy realized his mistake. He rushed to Gandhiji to seek his intervention to restore normalcy. Gandhiji agreed, but with some pre-conditions. He must live with him under the same roof without any Police or other protection in the most riot-torn area. He must confess his mistake. He must shed his western attire, and be in simple dress. As this proposition is very risky for him, as people were seething with

Rage against him, he must get the permission of his elderly father before agreeing to it. It was accepted by Suharwardy.

On 13th August, just two days before the D-Day Gandhiji and Suharwardy moved to a dilapidated building, majestic in name only, Hydari Mansion, in a remote suburb of Calcutta, The place had free access to anyone, whether he came to pray or to assault. It is a thrilling story well narrated in the book "Mahatma Gandhi-Last 200 days." Taunts and threats were met with poise, and the mission was successful in that peace was restored. Mountbatten ,commended the role of the "one man army" which restored peace in Calcutta- a feat a 55000 strong army was not able to achieve in the Punjab. (But, alas the satisfaction was only short-lived-as we shall see later.) Thus on 15th August, at the historic moment when the tri-color fluttered and the shouts, "Mahatma Gandhi-ki-Jai!": rent the Delhi air, the frail 78 year old man was in prayer and fasting in a remote place. On that day, people, Hindus and Muslims thronged to have his Dharshan and seek his blessings.

It had been suggested to Gandhiji that he should give a message to be broadcast in B.B.C. He declined. To the plea that it would look bad, he said, "Let it be so! Forget that I know English!"

Gandhiji observed the Independence Day in fasting and spinning and there was no special ceremony on the occasion in his camp, He observed "Mahadev Desai Day" early in the morning by holding prayers which included the recitation of the whole of the Gita. He walked all the way to the prayer ground which was thronged by 30000 strong crowds of Hindus and Muslims. He congratulated the Hindus and Muslims meeting together in perfect friendliness. In the evening he broke the 24 hours fast which he had started on the 14th evening. During the night he made a tour of the city to witness the scenes of fraternization.
