Dear Friends,

Elumalai works in a gas station in Chennai. His nature of job is not very high profile. His income is also not great. He has to support his mother, wife and a new born kid. For such families it is very difficult to make both ends meet. But they also have to celebrate functions at home, events in family, visit temples etc. Where will the extra money come from? How will they manage?

There is so much peer pressure from friends and relatives to celebrate special events - like the first birth day of the first child. Elumalai's kid was completing one year on 17th of February, 2008. Elders in the family advised him to go to temples and have special prayers done. It is customary for many families to visit Tirupathi - which is on top of seven hills - the name Elumalai comes from this pilgrim spot – have the head tonsured for the kid and the father on first birth days. But it involves travel expenses for the entire family which may work out very expensive. How about some local temples? How about getting all relatives and friends to a restaurant or home and have a party? Elumalai and his family thought of all options and worked out the cost involved, everything seemed to go beyond his limits.

But they have to celebrate the first birth day of their kid in some special form, as this is a special occasion for his entire family. How about helping others on this occasion? When this thought struck his mind, he picked up the phone and started calling some institutions in Chennai. When he called up Sevalaya, he was totally satisfied. He spoke to our Hon. Coordinator and asked him how much it will cost to pay for one lunch for the destitute and orphan children; whether he and his family can join the children for lunch and when he has to make the

payment. Elumalai says "I was moved when I got the answer that no advance payment is required and we can go over to the ashram on 17th Feb, have food with the children and then, if satisfied can make the payment. Even temples told us that we have to pay first. When we sat with the children and had food, our entire family was totally satisfied and we have decided that henceforth all our celebrations will be at Sevalaya only. I will also spread the message of Sevalaya to every car and two wheeler which comes to my gas station and suggest to them to contribute to the institution. Children are very happy here. The food is great. My mother was totally moved to see the old age home inmates".

Many families come to Sevalaya and celebrate such events. What is so special about Elumalai? His monthly income is Rs. 4500 and he paid Rs. 2500 for one lunch for the kids of Sevalaya on his kid's first birthday! This is more than 50% of his income.

You don't need money to donate, you only need a heart.

The fire chick that Sri Ramakrishna placed...

Swami Vivekananda sent the message, "Service to mankind alone is the service to the Lord" in the loudest and the clearest terms to the whole world. Gurubhais of Swamiji did not buy his theory and thought that he was introducing western concepts into Indian theories of Spirituality masquerading them as Sri Ramakrishna's teachings. In their view, Moksha, or Self realization alone is the goal of spirituality. And, the Master did not teach anything contradicting it. Swami put his foot down and incorporated service motive as an essential part of the Mission of Sri Ramakrishna Sangha he founded. Love of the Master Sri Ramakrishna bound all the disciples together, and all of them had enormous confidence in the leadership of Swami Vivekananda. They had abundant love for him and his views were therefore accepted in the formation of the Mission. It is because of this insistence by Swamiji, we find Sri Ramakrishna Math engaging in various welfare activities even today.

Well, where is the authority that Sri Ramakrishna spoke about service to people as essential part of spirituality? We get it from an episode narrated in Lilaprasanga quoted by the biographer Sudhir Dhar.

One day, the conversation Sri Ramakrishna had with his disciples drifted to Vaishnav religion. The Master observed," This religion enjoins upon its followers the practice of three things—delight in the name of God, compassion for all Jivas, (living beings) and service to the devotees of Vishnu." Just as he was finishing this sentence, he passed in to Samadhi. Still in an unconscious mood, he said, as if to himself,"Jiva daya, Jiva

daya! Thou fool! An insignificant worm crawling on earth, thou to show compassion to others! No, no, it is not compassion for others, but it must be service to all creatures, recognizing that all creatures are God!"

Even though all the devotees assembled there heard these words, Swami Vivekananda (then only Narendra) alone understood their implications. He said, "What a strange light have I discovered in the wonderful words of the Master! How beautifully he has reconciled the ideal of Bhakthi with the knowledge of the Vedanta! I have understood from these words of wisdom that the ideal of the Vedanta lived by the recluses in the forests can be practiced at home and applied to all our daily concerns. It is He who has become all the different creatures-object of our love; and yet He is beyond all these. Such realization of the Divine in all the created beings and the world leaves no room for egotism. Service of man, knowing him to be the manifestation of the God, purifies the heart, and in no time such an aspirant realizes himself as part and parcel of Godexistence-Knowledge-Bliss... Well, if God wills, the day will come when I shall proclaim the great Truth before the world at large-I shall make it the common property of all-the wise and the ignorant, the rich and the poor, the Brahmin and the Chandala!". Yes, that day came, and the Swamiji proclaimed this great Truth from one end of the earth to the other. Thus, the fire chick (agnikkunju) that Sri Ramakrishna placed in the young heart of Narendra turned in to a great spiritual conflagration that encompassed the whole world.

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
