

Dear Friends,

This is the time of the year in India, when most parents feel the pressure of educational expenses for their kids. This year most of the city schools in Chennai have announced a steep increase in the school fees as they have to pay extra to the teachers, as the Government pay scales have gone up. There are hikes ranging from 50% to 100% in almost all schools. Added to this, at least two sets of uniforms have to be purchased and books and note books to be provided for. Even if there are one or two kids in a house hold, the month of May is a tough month. This adds heat to the already hot climatic conditions in India and the parents literally sweat it out.

Every parent has a dream about their child and they somehow want to earn the money required to educate their children and see them through. They struggle a lot during the month of May to make both ends meet and run the family and at the same time take the extra load of academic expenses for their kids.

The same story happens in Sevalaya too; the only difference is that it is a much larger family with 1000 kids. Like parents we also nurture a dream for each kid. Though there is no school fee, we have to run the school, paying salary for the teachers, maintaining the building, paying the utility bills etc., for the school building. We also have to organize 2000 sets of uniforms, more that 10,000 note books. Of course the school books comes free, thanks to the Government of Tamil Nadu, we still need an average of Rs 1000 per kid to get the kid ready to go to school. This multiplies to Rs 10 lakhs (USD 20,000) every year to get all 1000 children attend the school with smiling faces.

Multiplication takes it to mind boggling levels,

but fortunately we have division also. It is not that one parent has to find all this money for 1000 children. We have all of you who have been contributing whatever you can for this cause and really make it easy to face the uphill task. Normally all of you send in your cheques and cash right in time so that by first week of June, we are ready to start the school year. I am sure this year will be no different. In addition, this year, Sevalaya's educational project has been recognized by Government of India as a project under Sec 35 AC of the Indian Income tax act, so donors in India can get 100% tax rebate on the donations made. (In fact the Sevalaya's children's home expenses and expenses for construction of new school building have also been recognized under Sec 35 AC, which will give 100% tax benefit.)

By first week of May we should be getting the class 12 results and by end of May we will get the class 10 results. Like in the past we are expecting near 100% results. We will keep you posted as and when the results are out.

Sundara Rama Iyer at Mannargudi

In a book we read recently, we came across an incident where a Police Informer made a vain bid to hijack Bharathiyar in to the British territory, posing as a friend. At the right moment when they were about to cross the Pondicherry threshold, due to the timely intervention of (the Divine and of) a friend, the bid was aborted. The side-light of the story is that just within a few days of the incident; Bharathiyar was entertaining the same "friend" in his house and was in a friendly banter with him. Family members and friends who witnessed this were naturally irked. Bharathiyar responded to their protests by singing the poem, "Pagaivanukkarulvaay!" (Love thine enemy, O! heart of mine! strike not the tiger threatening thee, but love it straight and true!-) (Tr: C.S.B.).

But both the informer and the Police failed to know that Bharathiyar had once slipped into British territory "throwing dust in to their eyes" as a Tamil expression would aptly describe it.

It was like this. This episode is narrated by Va. Raa, in his biography of Bharathiyar.

Kodiyalam Rangaswami Iyengar, a landlord and patriot who lived in Pondicherry was a good friend of "Sudhesis" (as the patriots in exile were called). He had devotion for Sri Aurobindo; and respect for V.V.S. Iyer. Though he was full of affection for Bharathiyar, he did not think much of his poetry. He was also of the view that Bharathiyar was not as bold and courageous as V.V.S. Iyer.

V.V.S Iyer, of course, has a proven merit as an adventurist. He was traveling to Pondicherry on his return to India from London. The British Police was on his trail. They were suspicious about the beard sporting, turban clad Sikh gentleman. Ultimately when they found the initials "V.V.S" inscribed on his suit case, they questioned him point blank and got the reply, "My name is Vir Vikram Singh!"

In a private conversation, Iyengar and his friends were talking almost derisively that Bharathiyar lacked such a spirit. Soon, however, they had to change their view.

Kodiyalam Iyengar had a posh bungalow in Nagai (not Nagappattinam) near Mannargudi. He used to visit there often and stay for some time. Once when he was sitting in the "Thinnai" at around 11.00 A.M and talking with friends, a horse drawn cart stopped in front of his bungalow. From it descended, a bald headed, clean shaven gentleman wearing a buttonless shirt and a coat over it. There was a zari upper cloth over the coat. The dhoti was tucked in the traditional Brahmin style. "Who is it coming here at this time?" Iyengar went closer with curiosity, and wow! It was none other than Bharathiyar! Iyengar could not believe his eyes. Bharathiyar said he was bored with the life- in- exile and decided to have a break! But how is it that he escaped from the Police and from the people at Pondicherry to whom he is but a wellknown figure? Ivengar acknowledged that Bharathiyar's adventure was much greater than that of V.V.S Iyer, whom the Police in India had scarcely seen.

Bharathiyar was introduced to local friends as "Sundara Rama Iyer". The whole week was spent in gaiety and mirth with Bharathiyar regaling them with humorous stories and songs. He was careful not to talk politics during this sojourn.

Kodiyalam Iyengar says he learnt his life's lesson; not to be hasty in judging people!
