Dear Friends,

In India rivers are considered as goddesses and we worship them. They are referred as Mother Ganga or Mother Cauvery etc. All ancient civilizations have developed on the banks of major rivers and the civilizations have been named after those rivers. Any life can exist only if there is good quality and quantity of water available. To ensure that we protect our water resources, our religion and practices in India refer to them as Goddesses and many rituals and festivals are designed so that we respect and maintain our water resources.

In this generation, we follow only the rituals and forget the meaning behind them. It is a pathetic scene to see the 18th day of the Tamil month Adi being celebrated on the banks of the river Cauvery, where we can see many newlywed couples and their friends and relatives gather on the river bank and offer flowers and fruits to the river, but there is not a single drop of water- only a vast expanse of sand!

Added to this rivers are used as open toilets, open washing area and all the drainage water and industrial waste are all diverted to rivers. Once upon a time, Coovam in Chennai was a nice river and people use to go boating in it. Today it is just a big "sakkadai".

One man in a small town, Musiri, near Trichy decided to change this, atleast in his hometown. His name is Subburaman and he runs an NGO "Scope". He has redesigned the public toilet near the river bank and made it as an Eco-friendly toilet. The human waste gets converted into natural manure, which can be used in organic farms. The urine is converted into natural

urea, and this can also be used in organic farms. With the result, the waste from the toilets can be marketed and sold. With this concept, he has come up with "Use and get paid toilets". As this is an attractive proposition, the local people have started using the public toilets and stopped polluting the river. He has designed such toilets for individual houses and for schools and other institution. With his help, many houses and schools in Musiri have converted to "Ecosan" toilets.

He has worked with the municipal corporation of Musiri and converted the garbage dump yard as a beautiful garden. Waste is segregated and biodegradable waste is converted into natural manure and non-degradable are recycled. He has also produced gas from human waste and we saw some houses getting this gas connection.

Sevalaya staff went on a one day awareness trip to this town. We are already constructing "Ecosan" toilets for the new school building at Sevalaya. We will slowly bring in other green concepts also in Sevalaya campus.

Next time when we have 18th day of Adi, let Cauvery flow with full force and let the rituals be done with the understanding of the real meaning.

Satyagraha Against Ourselves

Due to a gap in communication the hartal was observed in Delhi on 30" March 1919, instead of 6" April. It was a grand success with Hindus and Muslims united as one man, observing it earnestly. Swami Shraddananda delivered an address in Jumma Masjid. The authorities could not tolerate this bond of unity and violence was unleashed. Shraddananda requested Gandhiji to come to Delhi urgently. Gandhiji then was at Bombay and proposed to start for Delhi after the "celebrations" (as he called the hartal) on April 6 were over. As expected the hartal was 100% success, and Gandhiji was proceeding to Delhi, but on the way he was detained and was taken back to Bombay. The news of Gandhiji's detention and other atrocities reached people all around, and at Pydhuni where Gandhiji was dropped there was a huge crowd. Shouts of "Vandemataram" and "Allaho Akbar" rend the air and a procession was formed. As the procession was making its way, they confronted the mounted police at point blank range. The crowd was densely packed, and had almost broken through the police cordon. Gandhiji's voice could not be heard. The officer in charge of the mounted Police gave the order for dispersal of the crowd and immediately the mounted Police charged upon the crowd brandishing their lancer as they went. There was total confusion. Some got trampled under foot and others were mauled and crushed. The lancers blindly cut their way though the crowd. The horsemenandpeopleweremixedtogether in madconfusion.

There were atrocities in Ahmedabad and other places too. The Police had behaved monstrously and the crowd had retaliated with violence.AnattempthadbeenmadetopulluptherailsnearNadiad railway station. A government officer had been murdered in Viramgram. Ahmedabad had come under martial law. On Gandhiji's assurance that he would co operate to restore peace, the martial law was withdrawn. On April 13, addressing a meeting

Gandhiji tried to bring home to the people the sense of their wrong, declared a penitential fast for three days and appealed to the people to go on a similar fast for one day and suggested to thosewhohadbeenguilty of acts of violence to confess their guilt.

Gandhiji announced his decision to suspend Satyagraha as the people had not learnt the lesson of peace. He found himself a sharer in the guilt. There were people who were unhappy with his decision. In their view if peace were to be expected everywhere and be regarded as a condition precedent to launching Satyagraha, mass Satyagraha would be an impossibility. Butin Gandhiji's view, those who wanted to lead the people to Satyagraha ought to be able to keep the people within the limited non violence expected of them. At a meeting in Nadiad, he confessed to having made a Himalayan miscalculation. This statement brought down upon him no small amount of ridicule. But, what was the Himalayan miscalculation? Gandhiji speaks: - "Satyagrahi obeysthelaws of society intelligently and of his own free will, because he considers it to be his sacred duty to do so. It is only when a person has thus obeyed the laws of society scrupulously that he is in a position to judge as to what particular rules are good and just and what unjust and iniquitous. Only then does the right accrue to him for the civil disobedience of certain laws in well defined circumstances. My error lay in my failure to observe the necessary limitations. I had called on the people to launch upon the civil disobedience before they had thus qualified themselves forthat."

Gandhiji called this penitentiary f ast as "Satyagraha against ourselves."
