#### Dear Friends,

Friday evenings – it means different things to different generations. If you ask the previous generation in India, Friday is a very auspicious day and Friday evening is reserved for visiting temples. One of my traditionally minded relative went to see a girl, the first step in any arranged marriage. When the girl started talking about Friday evenings, this boy first assumed that she is going to talk about visiting temples. But she said that Friday evenings are for relaxation and she wants to have couple of beers and dance on Friday evenings. The boy fled from the scene.

The present generation's concept of Friday evenings, weekends, relaxation, have all changed. More exposure to other cultures through television, cinema, highly competitive environment in work place, more money to spare have all contributed to these changes. To cater to the needs of this new generation crowd, many night clubs and the like have started functioning in traditional cities like Chennai.

We had a disturbing accident in Chennai recently. A girl on two-wheeler was chased by four boys (one of them still in school) in a car, in the middle of 'Friday night'- all were under the influence of alcohol, and the girl was run over and she died. While we have all the sympathy for the girl's family, we have to also mention that this is the kind of price one has to pay, while adopting a different culture. Any culture comes with positive and negative points. It requires great mental strength to take only the positive from

anything and carefully leave out the negative. This is not possible for the common majority.

We have some young people visiting Sevalaya during weekends. They are students from employees colleges, of software organizations, some employed in other industries also. They come; spend time with the children and old people. Some of them take regular classes for the children. Some work in the agricultural fields, planting trees etc. Some just sit and talk with the old people. Some of them sit our library and read books. But these numbers are small. May be there are such people going to other organizations like Sevalaya and spending their weekends.

These people have spare time and some of them have extra money to spare. So they contribute both time and money. At the end of the academic year, when the results are out, these people know that they had a role to play in Sevalaya's 100% result. When they see the growth of the school building, when they see the trees grow, when they see the smile on the children's faces, when the see the old people holding their hands with warmth they get their week-end relaxation! Alcohol and nightclubs fade in comparison.

Volunteering and helping to do good work will give you lot of satisfaction and re-charge your batteries for the coming week. Try this one weekend.

Mr. Murali, a software Engineer from Covansys Technologies is also our new volunteer who takes part in the activities of Sevalaya on Sundays regularly.

### **Education for Emancipation**

There is a vast reservoir of resources in this country in the form of children. It is pathetic that most of these are destroyed, unutilised or under-utilised. What a criminal waste!

There are street children, rag pickers, destitute and orphans whom nobody would care. Poorer sections would send their children in bondage, or, better to work in the fields, factories or teashops rather than send them to schools. Even for the more fortunately placed, what they call education is kilo loads of books, oppression by home-works and corporal punishments in the name of discipline. We have mostly, not schools, but teaching shops rather keen on counting money than countenancing the problems of children. We can swear as Bharathi did, in forty thousand temples that there is no gingilee seed worth of benefit!

Addressing the school run by Maria Montessori in Italy, Gandhiji averred that the real Peace for which the whole world is hungering would be possible only if we begin with the children. Bharathi was no less emphatic when he said that the liberation of mankind was possible only with the liberation of India for which the sole key was national education. Swami Vivekananda deemed neglect of the masses as a national sin and held every man a traitor who having been educated at their expense paid not the least heed to them.

Bharathiyar wanted a school to be opened for every two or three households in a village, (not even half-an- anna is to be charged as fees; books, dress and food to be provided free as far as may be possible.), Swami Vivekananda wanted his disciples to go from village to village, and door to door, spreading education.

The question then arises as to what type of education is to be given. What is good education? Swami Vivekananda provides the

answer: we cannot teach a child more than we can grow a plant. What we can do is to unveil the knowledge within. We should give positive ideas. Education that does not help the common mass of the people to equip themselves for the struggle for life, which does not bring one strength of character, a spirit of philanthropy and the courage of a lion. Is it worth the name? . Education is that by which character is formed, strength of mind is increased, the intellect is expanded and by which one can stand on one's own feet. The end of all education should be man making. Fearlessness, service to the needy, dignity of labour, courage of conviction and other good values have been prescribed by all the three as forming good education .All of them were emphatic that education should be through the mother tongue. Gandhiji had no manner of doubt in regarding the village handicrafts as the pivot and centre of education.

In Sevalaya, we have as of now, 130 orphan destitute children in our Home. Nearly 530 rural, poor, children in all are given textbooks, note books, uniform etc, besides free education without any fees. The medium of education is Tamil, the regional language. Corporal punishment is banned in the institution. The educational curriculum includes values of our three guiding stars. The thrust is on imparting good values like fearlessness that were preached by them. We train our children in crafts like tailoring, handicrafts, screen-printing, binding etc. In addition, they are trained in different skills like music, dance, yoga, painting, sports, agriculture, Computers etc. -All that our inspirers would applaud as Man making and life supporting.

May the Trio bless us and give us the strength to carry forward!
