Unless the new generation which has become very rich or rich, share their resources with the underprivileged, we will have a big problem as the outside world is treating India as a developed country while the reality is only a section of India has really developed.

In this context, the Joy of Giving week is really significant and let us all get into the habit of giving.

These impulses, reaching the subjective mind of a person, react with the existing impressions of his own past actions that are carefully stored away in the subjective layer and express themselves in the world outside through the five organs of action."
