Modern gaushala inaugurated Hygienic housing for 70 cows

For those with a religious bent of mind, it is worshipping a Goddess; for animal lovers, it is taking care of an animal with respect and dignity; for environmentalists, it is providing organic manure to strengthen Mother Earth; for nutritionists, it is reinforcing the virtues of cows milk, the most healthy drink.

Since 1991, Sevalaya has been taking care of cows both milch and dry cows. With the new gaushala, housing 65 cows, Sevalaya continues to pursue this noble cause with improved infrastructure and renewed vigor.

Inaugurating the the newly built Vinobhaji gaushala in 1 acre land at



Sevalaya campus, N. Vittal, IAS (Retd), Former Central Vigilance Commissioner stressed on the need to protect the dry cows, highlighting that one of the basic causes for many social evils plaguing the world today was because of the human tendency to value everthing only on monetary terms and forgetting the social value. Quoting an ancient Tamil verse which proclaims that this world survives only because the selfless service of those who live for others, he lauded the efforts of Muralidharan, the founder of Sevalaya and the team for the sustained services for the poor and the needy for 27 years and offered his best wishes for the institution to grow and reach out to more and more needy people.

The new *gaushala* has excellant facilities for the cows. Each cow is in a separate enclosure with easy access to feed and water. The urine flows through a specially constructed channel draining into a pit where it is diluted and used as an organic fertilizer. The gaushala, has been constructed at a cost of Rs 30 lakhs. Rajiv Bharwani of Hongkong has sponsored this construction.

Joy of Giving: Way of Life

Sevalaya School is located in a small village, as you all know. The very purpose of Sevalaya School is to serve the rural poor. But running a school in a small village has its own problem. Getting good quality teachers is a problem. This has become a problem in city schools also, may be good quality teachers are not there in the market. When we have this gap, we can fill it up with committed volunteers taking classes, along with the available teachers. But again the distance form city becomes a problem even for the most committed volunteer.

We have been trying to use technology to solve the problem. Last year we started using Video conferencing facility so that volunteers from remote locations can take This year the next generation of our classes. We installed our own transmission tower, improved the infrastructure with more projectors and screens and speakers etc. We got good response for this from our supporters, Prof. Srinivasan from Florida, USA started conducted Physics classes, our committee member Ramesh conducted Maths classes, Paddy from

Bangalore conducted English classes, Indu Madhavan from Australia conducted Maths classes and many more. We also had Manoj and team from UK having story telling for the small kids. Of course we had power cuts, the network going down etc., but none of this dampened the enthusiasm of volunteers as they saw the children enjoying the classes.

Page Pierre Foundation has been a strong supporter of Sevalaya since 2008. Its contribution has been singular in the creation of excellent and crucially required infrastructure in Sevalaya's Kasuva Campus. They include dining hall, boys home, girls home and solarisation of most of the campus.

In continuation of the previous years' grants, this year the Page Pierre Foundation has generously donated USD 90,000 for:

- •the construction and purchase of equipments for a Science Centre at Sevalaya. Sevalaya would be the first school to have a Science Centre in Thiruvallur Dist.
- •the construction of Hostel auditorium in the old Gaushala site at Sevalaya
- purchase of Furniture for the school and
- Sound proof false roofing for the 3rd floor of High School Building.

Science Centre: In Mahakavi Bharathiyar Higher Secondary School, presently 2000 students are studying. At present there are no Science Centres in Sevalaya or in the surrounding schools in Thiruvallur District. A Science Centre in Sevalaya will not only benefit the thousands of students studying here, year on year but will also benefit the surrounding schools and students in the surrounding villages.

The Science Centre will foster curiosity, critical thinking and creativity through hands-on programs. The program will catalyse Sevalaya school and educators to improve the content and quality of education for rural children and teachers. The program will help to internalize and rapidly disseminate hands-on science into the school system and create a model for replication. It would significantly improve the classroom learning environment – better and more productive student-teacher interaction, more hands-on learning opportunities, improved overall learning and understanding of concepts, higher levels of curiosity and creativity.

Hostel Auditorium at old

gaushala site: It has been decided to construct an auditorium for the hostel children at the site where the old gaushala stood. The hostel students in Sevalaya's Children's Home will be

benefitted by an auditorium which can be used by them for their Yoga sessions, activities conducted by Corporates for the students, NSS camps conducted by college students and many other events. These activities will be in the ground floor and the building will have a first floor which will have a dormitory, coordinator rooms and toilets.

A stage will be built in the ground floor auditorium and audio visual equipments including speakers, mikes, projector, screen, computer would be provided for conducting programs.

Furniture for Primary and High

School: Every year there is increase in student strength in the school, where on an average about 120 children join. Thanks to the funds from Page Pierre Foundation, Sevalaya students would be benefitted from additional writing tables and sitting benches.

Sound proof partition: The third floor in the High School building needed Sound proof partition between classrooms. This has been possible with the support received from Page Pierre Foundation.

She used to work as a daily labourer in the fields but her health conditions were a hindrance. Then when her daughter was admitted in 2008, she came to know

through one of the teachers that there was a vacancy in Balwadi and joined as a helper. Slowly she started assisting in the HM's office, putting things in order, maintaining the files, records and other important documents . Her activeness, cheerfulness and maturity soon made her an invaluable assistant and when the then Headmaster G. Chittibabu came to know that she had two arrears to be cleared in her Std X he motivated her to complete it.

After completing Std X with the help of Science teacher G.Chittibabu and Social Sciences teacher, R Vijayaraghavan, Kanchana who is an intelligent person,

got motivated to study further. Vijayaraghavan was ready to advise and guide her in every step. After completing her duties at office, she would come and sit with the XII students to learn English in the evening special class. Whenever the Accounts and Economics teachers were free, she would get her doubts cleared. Soon she had cleared XII exams. There is no stopping and now she is doing her B.Lit in Tamil, thanks to Mara Breech Foundation who are supporting the education of Sevalaya staff. She will graduate in 2017 and then dreams of completing the Pandit training course and becoming a teacher. Her son is now in Std IX and daughter is in Std VII.

Whether it is rain or shine she is there at 8.00 a.m everyday and opens the office and starts the work for the day. She is ready to step in and help when there is additional work in the evenings on holidays and Sundays. She is one of the strong pillars of the organization sharing a good rapport with all the staff and students, ready to step in and help wherever required and in whatever way possible.

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Not lost anything, not even money, certainly not the soul!

Gandhiji's stay in Pretoria was a most valuable experience in his life. Among other things, it was there that he learnt the secret of success as a lawyer.

He was engaged to assist the attorney of Dada Abdulla in a suit for 40000 Pounds arising out of business relationships. Several intricate points of law and accounting were involved in the case. Gandhiji's task was to prepare the plaintiff's case and sifting of facts in support.

Facts are three fourth of Law. If we take care of facts, law will take care of itself. Facts means truth, and once we adhere to truth, law comes to our aid naturally. Convinced of this, Gandhiji dived deep in to the voluminous documents, and was able to see the facts in a new light. He was convinced that by the very facts of the case Dada Abdulla was sure to win. But he reflected. We do not know

Court's vagaries. How long the case will prolong, nobody could guess. Which judge would take the case was also a point to be considered. Meantime, Dada and the opposite party, Tyeb Sheth, who was also a relative and a business magnate, would be incurring huge expenditure which could be profitably put in business. The mental agony and growing animosity between the two families were immeasurable. Gandhiji boldly suggested placing the case before an arbitrator acceptable to both the parties. Even though there was hesitation on both sides, ultimately they saw reason and an arbitrator was appointed. The arbitration went in favour of Dada Abdulla. A very huge sum was to be paid by Tyeb Sheth, which would have led to his bankruptcy. In the business community, bankruptcy was worse than death. Gandhiji suggested to Dada to help Tyeb Sheth out by agreeing to receive the payment in instalments spread over a long period. It was more difficult to convince him of the proposition, than it was even in working out a consensus about arbitration. Dada ultimately agreed and it was ultimately, "all's well."

Gandhiji concludes," My joy was boundless. I had learnt the true practice of Law. I had learnt to find out the better side of human nature and to enter men's hearts. I realized that the true function of a lawyer was to unite parties riven asunder. The lesson was so indelibly burnt into me that a large part of my time during the twenty years of my practice as a lawyer was occupied in bringing about private compromises of hundreds of cases. I lost nothing thereby-not even money, certainly not my soul."
