100% pass in XI and 99.2% pass in X and XII Std

The searing heat of Chennai in May was just not felt at the Sevalaya campus at Kasuva as the results started coming in. The new arrangements made by the Tamilnadu government made it possible to download the results of the Std X, XI and XII Board in the school itself. On 16th May 2018 when the XII results were declared the whole place was ringing with the sounds of joy and laughter as

123 out of 124 students had successfully cleared the exams with excellent marks. 82% of the students secured first division marks and 20% of these students scored more than 80%.

The Kasuva centre wore a festive look again on 23rd May 2018 when the X Std results were announced. 128 out of 129 students passed with more than 64% scoring first division marks of whom

26% scored more than 75%.

The icing on the cake was the 100% pass in XI std results of which were declared on 30th May 2018. All the 138 students were successful and 6 of them had scored above 80%.

No small achievement considering the fact that many of these students live in small single room houses with no special facilities for studying. These children also have to help out their parents, who mostly work as daily wage earners and struggle to keep the family afloat.

The credit for this achievement definitely goes to the unstinted support of well-wishers, philanthropists and corporates. The teachers of Sevalaya spared no efforts to coach the children and spent extra hours in the mornings, evenings and all holidays to sit with their wards and patiently guide them at their own pace. In the evenings many houses have drunken parents creating a nuisance and children are able to study only because they remain at school with their teachers. Snacks from the dining hall gives them energy and the teachers' presence, a world of comfort where they forget about all the troubles at home and concentrate on their studies.

During weekends, Sevalaya plans to utilize the bus to conduct study/cultural tours for the high school and higher secondary school students to places of tourism/historical/cultural importance in Thiruvallur and Chennai districts. The bus will also be used to transport the students to various sports competitions around Thiruvallur and Chennai districts.

Once again Sevalaya children have proved that underprivileged children from the villages can do equally well in academics if proper facilities are given to them. A school with proper classrooms, laboratories, equipment, books, note books, other learning kits, library and above all caring teachers, will make sure that children who have lost both parents, children with single parents, children from broken families, children from bonded labour families, children who have criminal background and left under the care of Sevalaya under Juvenile Justice act, children from very poor village families can also do well in 10th, 11th and 12th grade exams.

Sevalaya has achieved 100% result in 11th grade (138/138) and 99.2% results in 10th grade (126/127) and 12th grade (123/124) this year.

The achievement assumes significance, considering the background of the

students of the school, most of whom are first generation learners. This has been possible only with the support of donors like you who can experience the joy of giving, when your contributions have made a positive change in the lives of the under privileged children.

Sevalaya thanks you for your continuous support in the last 30 years. This year also we have 2000+ such children, who need your support. Sevalaya has a dream - a dream to prepare our students to achieve National level in sports in the current year.

The organisation is in the process of preparing the ground for this. There is an increased emphasis on sports activities. All facilities, including infrastructure, training, ensuring physical fitness are all provided to the children. Every year a sports camp is conducted in summer, in which more focussed and special training is provided to the children talented in sports.

This year the Summer Sports camp was held from 23rd April 18 to 12th May 18. Sevalaya's PT Masters A Sankarapandian, Kalirajan, Saravanan, Volleyball coach and Elanchezhian Athletic coach were the trainers. 75 children participated in the camp.

During the camp, the day started with regular physical exercises and fitness work out sessions. This was followed by training in athletics - sprint, jump events, and throw events, Handball, volleyball and basketball. The students also went for cross country jogging. The students were also shown videos of the final events in the recently concluded



Common Wealth Games, followed by a discussion on the same.

Sevalaya alumnus Pradeep who is a member of the Periyar University Hand ball team and has represented the State, along with his friends who are also University players visited the camp and shared their experiences with the students.

Kavitha, A Sevalaya aulmna who is now a student of Sports Development Authority of Tamilnadu (SDAT) hostel also visited the camp and spoke to the students.

Nutritious food like Soya Chunks, dates, chappathies and milk and ragimalt were

regularly provided to the camp students.

Jerseys and shorts were distributed to all the participants. This was sponsored by T Nagaraj, Lakshmi and family, donors from Madurai.

The valedictory function of the camp was held on 12th May 2018. Olympic Gold medallist V Bhaskaran, Former Captain of the Indian Hockey team which won Gold in Olympics 1980, was the Chief Guest. Very much impressed and moved by the services of Sevalaya, especially the importance given to Sports, he assured unconditional help to the organisation for any of their requirements in Sports, both financial and networking. Dr Bohra Sports Academy sponsored the certificates and Best Player Awards for 10 top students in the camp. The Chairman of the Academy, Rahul Bohra, distributed the certificates and the awards.

26 students from Sevalaya (14 boys and 12 girls) who have reached the regional level in athletics, participated in the World Beaters Talent Spotting scheme by the Sports Development Authority of Tamilnadu (SDAT). The scheme implemented by SDAT is to spot the promising talent in sports among students of Std VI to VIII. It was a residential camp from 2nd May to 16th May 2018. In these camps talented boys and girls are identified and trained for state selection trails.

46 gypsy families live near Tamaraipakkam kootu road, many of them in small thatched huts. They earn their living by selling fancy items in the different villages or during various village festivals. They purchase items like clips, bangles, combs etc at the wholesale markets in Chennai and carry them to various places.

Only 50% of the children in this group are interested in studies and very few among them desire to pursue higher education and Devi is one of them. She joined Sevalaya in 6th standard. "I enjoy the classes. Teachers are always ready to clear doubts and give extra coaching," says Devi. She attributes her success to the guidance given by teachers. She assiduously followed their instructions,



doing self -study late into the night, completing the assignments given for the day. In their small two roomed house she shares with 6 other members of her family, she says would sit in the small puja room studying while the rest of the family would be in the other room watching TV, cooking and sharing the day's experiences.

Devi aspires to become a doctor. She especially likes the Old Age Home as it caters to the needs of senior citizens and wants to help people after she completes her studies.

Magic Show

The very word MAGIC casts its spell on everyone irrespective of age. This summer holidays saw 71 Children and 12 elders enjoying a Magic Show organized by Abbas Cultural Academy on 13th May 2018 at Mylapore Fine arts club. This programme was conducted P M Mithra, a very popular magician. A few children had been lucky to see a similar show last year but there were many children who were seeing such a show for the first time. 3 girls got an opportunity to be with the great magician and be a part of his tricks.

The Great Trial (1922)

Gandhiji's decision to withdraw the Bardoli programme emboldened the Government. They were waiting for the opportune time to arrest him. Expecting this Gandhiji wrote: "I desire that people should maintain self-control and consider the day of my arrest, a day of rejoicing. The Government believes that I am the soul of all this agitation and that if I am removed it will be left in peace. The only thing that remains is for it to measure the strength of people Let the people preserve perfect peace and calmness."

Gandhiji was arrested, as expected, and made to face trial before Justice Broomfield. The offences were three articles in Young India "Tampering with Loyalty", "Puzzle and its Solution", and "Shaking the Manes."

Gandhiji pleaded guilty to the charges. He made a statement, in which he inter alia said, "I hold it to be disaffected towards a government which in its totality has done more harm to India than any previous

system. India is less manly under British rule than she ever was before. Holding such a belief, I consider it to be a sin to have affection for the system. And it has been a precious privilege for me to be able to write what I have in the various articles tendered in evidence against me..

..In my humble opinion, non-co-operation with evil is as much a duty as it is co-operation with good. But in the past, non-co-operation has been deliberately expressed in violence to the evil -doer. I am endeavouring to show to my country men, that violent non-co-operation only multiplies evil, and that as evil can only be sustained by violence, withdrawal of support of evil requires complete abstention from violence. Non-violence implies voluntary submission to the penalty for non-co-operation with evil. I am, here, therefore, to invite and submit cheerfully to the highest penalty that can be inflicted upon me what in law is deliberate crime, and what appears to me to be the highest duty of a citizen.

The only course open to you, the judge and the assessors, is either to resign your posts and thus dissociate yourselves from evil, if you feel that the law that you are called upon to administer is an evil, and that in reality I am innocent, or to inflict upon me the severest penalty, if you believe that the system and the law you are assisting to administer are good for the people of the country, and my activity, is therefore, injurious to the common weal."

The judge passed upon Gandhiji a simple imprisonment of six years citing the precedent of the case against Bal Gangadhar Tilak. He hastened to add that he was doing this as it was his duty to do so. "If the course of events in India should make it possible for the Government to reduce the period and release you, no one will be better pleased than I." observed the judge. Gandhiji expressed his happiness at being compared with Bal Gangadhar Tilak. Gandhiji was incarcerated in Yerawada prison.

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
