

#### **Environmental Education**

Sevalaya imparts environment education to its children and implements the same in the campus. It segregates the degradable and non degradable wastes for disposal. Sevalaya's Kasuva Campus is thus a green zone.

Tapping Solar Energy 70% of operations in Sevalaya's Kasuva campus is powered by Solar energy.

## Organic Farming

Organic Farming is implemented in the three centres namely, Kasuva, Thirumalaivaiyavur and Madhuranthakam. Cow dung, Panchakavya and Vermicompost are used as bio fertilizers. Sevalaya conducts regular workshops to propagate organic farming.

#### Vinobhaji Gaushala

Vinobhaji Gaushala shelters dry cows. It also shelters cows yielding milk which is consumed by residents.

#### **Mobile Medical Camps**

Mobile Medical Camps are conducted regularly through dedicated team of doctors and nurses using mobile medical vans, for eye, dental and general check up and physiotherapy. Free medicines are given for the benefit of the residents and villagers.

#### Homes

#### (Swami Vivekananda Unit)

Swami Vivekananda Boys Home and Mother Teresa Girls Home (Partly aided, recognized as "Children's Home" under Dept. of Social Defence, Govt. of Tamilnadu)

Presently these homes shelter around 175 children. These homes provide food, education, opportunities for skill development and talent promotion in an atmosphere of love and care.

These children are taken care of, till they become self reliant. Many of the children are now well settled in life, pursuing careers as qualified mechanics, electricians, artisans, bank officers, nurses and software professionals.

**Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa Old Age Home** (Unaided, Recognized by the Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Tamilnadu)

It is a home for poor and destitute senior citizens. The home strives to provide dignified living to them in the evening of their lives. 80 senior citizens have made their homes here.

**Integrated Campus** (Aided, Recognized by the Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Tamilnadu)

Sevalaya has been selected by the Govt of Tamilnadu for implementation of its programme in Thiruvallur District, the Integrated Campus under which 25 destitute senior citizens and 25 destitute children are housed in one campus.

#### Mahatma Gandhi Medical Centre

With 12 beds provides quality health care free of cost to the residents and the neighbouring community.

- Old Age Home housing 80 senior citizens
- Integrated Campus housing 25 senior citizens and 25 children in the same campus

Quality education, offered free, has been the most potent tool for transformation. Today, the school has a strength of over 2,000 and achieves centum or near centum results every year.

# Montessori in Tamil: breaking the economic divide

Breaking the myth that Montessori method of education is costly and for the rich, Sevalaya started a free Montessori school in 2009 with 30 children. What is more, Sevalaya is among just a dozen schools to offer Montessori teaching in Tamil, the local language. The nearest Montessori school (English medium and operating as a commercial enterprise) in Thiruvallur district is 15 KMs away.

The "whole child" approach of the Montessori method helps each child to reach their full potential in all areas of life. The range of creative activities at Sevalaya, where the children learn at their own pace and under the guidance of well-trained teachers, who observe more than intervene, promote the development of social skills, emotional growth, and physical co-ordination. These are combined with the proven

benefits of children articulating and doing creative activities in mother tongue, besides English. This enhances their linguistic and motor skills.

This academic year, Sevalaya saw a 20% increase in admissions in the new Montessori section alone - from 267 (in 2015-16) to 333 (in 2016-17). More than half of them are girl children.

Thanks to funding by Page Pierre, our longstanding donor, the Montessori activity area is now spacious and well ventilated.

Sevalaya provides education, transport and nutritious meals to the tiny tots free of cost.

## SP: The come back man



"Choose a job you love and you will never have to work a day in your life"-this quote from Chinese philosopher Confucius fits A Sankarapandian (SP), P.E.T master at Sevalaya's Mahakavi Bharathiyar Higher Secondary School, who has come back to work at Sevalaya not once, but twice after having taken up other jobs.

SP completed his Master of Physical Education and Sports Sciences and dreamt of coaching students to achieve laurels in sports. In 2003 he got that opportunity at Sevalaya. Residing in the campus he was not only a sports teacher but also a yoga teacher and care giver to the resident children. He is a tour guide for the first time visitors to the campus.

New opportunities, meeting targets, team work, building sustaining relationships, understanding the mindset of hostel students and providing an emotional support wherever required, helped shape his personality. He says, "It was a holistic opportunity. The management gave me necessary support and encouraged me to take students for different games in and around Chennai and Thiruvallur." The exposure helped him to gain clarity about the strategies needed to make significant strides in competitive

Persuaded by increasing family commitments, he moved to a better paying job to New Delhi, in 2005. "Soon, I found the new atmosphere very dull, activities were routine. There was not much interest in developing sports and in six months, I decided to come back." SP happily settled back in his favourite job and his young wife, a qualified teacher, also joined Sevalaya school. Things were going well, till the birth of his daughter. This time, his presence was needed at his village. He worked in a nearby B.Ed college for 3 years. At the bidding of his family in 2012, he switched to a State Government job,

"My family and friends had misgivings, but I was clear. My heart longed to come back" says SP. He rejoined in 2013 and was amazed to see the growth and changes in the organization, since he had left. It was a wonderful homecoming and SP happily settled into the groove. There was much more to be done now and he was put in charge of charting Sevalaya's sharpened sports mission.

He is practically on call the whole day, even during holidays, ever ready with a smiling face to take care of any additional work.

Every year, Sevalaya's Community Colleges skill 800 rural youth, who are otherwise stuck in an academic dead end, leading to their livelihood.

# Community Colleges: Rapid growth and Jobs for the unemployed



Sevalaya's community colleges are a stepping stone for unemployed youth to join the mainstream. Its five community colleges provide a bouquet of courses ranging from four to six months.

The curriculum is based on the industry requirements. Guest lectures are arranged from industry experts who assist in providing internship/ placements. The batch size is restricted to about 25 to maximize individual attention. Two / Three batches are conducted each year depending on the trade.

Sevalaya's training comes packaged with value education, functional English and communication skills as also basic

T Nancy recalls: "The four high school years I spent at Sevalaya are the highlight of my life." Her future looked bleak after her father Thangaraj Joshua, an accountant in a brick kiln company, met with an accident that severely

injured his right hand. In the disruption that followed, she was forced to switch from an English medium school to Tamil medium at Sevalaya, in her Std VIII. That 'set back' proved the turning point in her life. She pursued her studies with

tenacity and secured 88% in Std X Board exams.

After completing Std XII in 2010, she did BSc in Nursing. Currently, she is a trainee coder in Global services company in Chennai, which specializes in Medical coding. She is on the verge of being confirmed in her job.

As the only child, she is determined to see that her parents are well settled and escape poverty. Nancy volunteers at Sevalaya every Saturday and teaches the students the basics of Nursing assistant course. She is happy to stay in touch with her alma mater.

Nancy says, "I will forever be grateful for the care my teachers showered on me during my high school days. I will continue to serve Sevalaya and the community."

When **M Esther** joined the Nursing Assistant course at Sevalaya's Mahakavi Bharathiyar community college, in July 2016, she had no idea that her career will lift off as soon as she completed the course. Today, she is working as an Assistant in the Nursing department at Teja Hospital, Chennai. Says Esther, "I have three sisters at home and I'm glad that I can contribute to the family income."





R Ajithkumar dropped out of school after failing Std X exams. After trying out a few things, he joined the Electrician training course at Sevalaya's Mahakavi Bharathiyar community college. Ajithkumar says, "Even while I was finishing the course, I was sent for internship at Sunmeister- a Solar energy company, and now I am working full time for them. The training at the college was comprehensive and industry relevant."

# Empowering nomadic Irula women post floods

Sewing machine has turned saviour for a large number of women in distress, supporting or supplementing livelihood. One group to benefit from this initiative of Sevalaya are 100 families belonging to the nomadic *Irula* community. The sewing machines have given them a means of livelihood after the epochal floods of end 2015 washed away their belongings. Gummidipoondi and Ponneri taluks were two of the worst hit taluks, during the floods.

These machines were distributed in July 2016.

# Sewing machines, plus tailoring training

In March 2016, 50 flood affected *Irula* women in Tiruttani taluk, were presented sewing machines and accessories. In addition, to maximize the benefits, they were provided training so that they could learn the intricacies

of the stitching trade continuously for a year. The classes were held at Tiruttani once a month for one year.

All the beneficiaries learnt different styles of garment cutting, stitching, and embroidery work. Many of them stitch garments and supplement the family income. They are also encouraged to seek employment outside of their village.

# 3 Healthcare

With healthcare facilities woefully lacking, Sevalaya stepped in to fill the breech, steadily enlarging reach and scope of intervention.

# Target: Complimentary healthcare to 2 lac villagers

Until 1994 Kasuva village did not even have basic medical facilities. The nearest Public Health centre was about 3 KMs away and it functioned only till noon. To mitigate this a medical centre was started at Sevalaya, which has now grown into a 12 bedded hospital. It is

often a first responder and provides medical treatment to the surrounding 16 villges within 3 KM radius. It also offers treatment to the 80 senior citizens, 173 girls and boys and 40 staff who reside in the campus as well as 2,000 school kids. The Centre is equipped to deal with a

variety of illnesses and can treat patients suffering from dehydration, diabetes and stress. Treatment, including medicines is offered free of cost.

#### Medical outreach

Over the past year, partnerships with corporate institutions and private individuals have led to enhanced reach of medical care in reaching out to the community to provide quality health care at their doorstep. A mobile medial unit, with a team of a doctor and a couple of nursing assistants visit 40 rural villages each month, in Thiruvallur District. Medicines worth Rs. 1,80,000 are dispensed free to the patients, annually. Regular eye camps are conducted and prognosis is suggested on

a case by case basis. Patients requiring surgeries are referred to hospitals that provide them free of cost. Their follow up care is also complimentary. Physiotherapy camps are conducted from time to time at villages to alleviate patients who suffer from Osteo arthritis, cervical and multiple joint pains.

#### Saratha, Guruvoyal village

I am a destitute 65 year old and a daily wage earner. My eye sight was deteriorating, leading to loss of wages. At the eye camp conducted by Sevalaya in our village, surgery was advised. They took care of all the paper work and took me to the hospital. They also took care of my post operative care and prescribed reading glasses. Now I can see very well.



#### Manju, Karani village

When I took my child to Sevalaya mobile medical unit which came to my village, the first thing that struck me was the loving care with which the doctor asked about the history of my child's health and prescribed medicines accordingly. Within two days my child got better and we were very relieved. This is a great boon for people like us who are daily wage earners and cannot take a day off to go to the PHC which is 7 KMs away.

# Water ATM: Clean drinking water for villagers

Adhigathur, a remote village in Thiruvallur district was identified as a test village to provide RO water to the families, living in the village.

Water ATM is a novel concept, where the village drinking water, stored in the municipal tank is cleaned through an RO filtration system and provided to the villages. This eliminates the hardness of the water, which can then be safely used for drinking purposes.



Sevalaya installed the RO plant in the village and dedicated it to the village panchayat to provide clean drinking water to the villagers. About 500 families have been provided with a

'Water ATM card'. They can refill the ATM card at the local panchayat office and draw water based on their needs.

# 4 Environment

Persuasion and participative action can create enthusiasm of the community in favour of environment.



## Smokeless Bhogi

1,000 students from four local schools including Sevalaya and New College, Chennai undertook a 5 KM walk around Pakkam and Puliyur villages, spreading the message of smokeless Bhogi. The Bhogi tradition of collecting and burning unwanted materials is environmentally unsafe.

Sevalaya has been running this seasonal campaign since 1990, with perceivable reduction in this traditional practice.

## Conservation gospel

Born out of a Shell - NXplorers workshop on energy, Sevalaya NXplorers club took up creating awareness about water and energy conservation in the villages.

From November 2016 to March 2017, Sevalaya students visited two villages and two schools in a 10 KM radius. 190 villagers and about 260 students participated in the events. Says R Sridhar, a Std VIII student of Govt Middle School, Melapedu: "Their explanation about saving water through drama and folk songs was very captivating. The teachers also shared many ideas and thoughts on saving water. I will take this message to my family and friends in my village."

Vikash Mishra, Country Head External Relations, Shell India said, "We strongly believe that this collaborative learning in food-water-energy nexus will help in developing thinking skills and creating a sense of stewardship amongst the youth."



# Here a tree, there a tree, everywhere a tree



When the children were taught about the seed ball - a clay ball made from red soil, water, and vermicomposting with a seed embedded in it, they were fascinated and went about making thousands of them. Since all the three vital elements (water, clay and organic fertilizer) bind the seed, the process of germination is facilitated and it can sprout anywhere - ditches, shady or arid areas. These seed balls were distributed by the children to their parents who in turn have 'thrown' it in and around their homes. There is a 50% chance that a tree will sprout.

V Arivarasan, Program director, Parikshan Charitable Trust, Chennai, and G Dharakeswari, Director, Deva tech Info Systems Pvt. Ltd., Chennai, introduced the concept and demonstrated this activity.

Volunteers from various corporates were involved in an afforestation campaign after cyclone Vardah destroyed over 300 trees in the campus. A total of over 550 trees were planted in the campus and nearby villages.

## 900 Bio mass stoves to rural kitchens



Energy efficient and low smoke bio mass stoves were distributed to 900 rural families around Kasuva village, Thiruvallur District. As a part of the Disaster Relief and Rehabilitation initiative of Shell India Pvt Ltd, post the Chennai floods, these stoves reduce smoke by 80%, improve cooking

experience and are environment friendly.

35 volunteers from Shell India Pvt Ltd were present and along with Sevalaya staff helped in the distribution of stoves.

A video on how to use the stove, and highlighting the do's and don'ts was

screened. Eight stalls were set up at the venue, where volunteers from Shell gave a practical demonstration for the villagers on how to use the stove.

It is our small step towards reducing the carbon footprint in rural Tamilnadu.

# Rural sports: connecting with the youth



Sevalaya has been organising an annual rural volleyball tournament for the past 17 years, coinciding with Pongal festival. With 56 teams from 26 villages participating, the tournament has been successful in engaging 700 village youth. Velliyur volleyball club was declared the Champion this year. The trophies and medals were sponsored by Henry Maris, Secretary of Nazareth College of Arts and Science, Avadi, Chennai.

#### **Basketball**

Beginning 2016, Sevalaya introduced interschool basketball tournament for boys and girls. 14 schools participated in the tournament this year. Boys and girls from ICF school team won the team championship. Runners up in the boys category was Sethu Baskara Matriculation Higher Secondary School, Ambattur and Sevalaya school was the runners up in the girls category.

#### Thiramaipor (War of talent)

Thiramaipor was started as a joint venture between Sevalaya and Rotract club of Akash in 2008 to foster and nurture sports talent among rural schools, in Thiruvallur district. The weekend sports meet covers 8 games, besides track and field events.

The events were held on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of February this year. In a matter of nine years, the event has grown, from just four schools from Thiruvallur district, to twenty five schools and 540 students from three districts (Thiruvallur, Kanchipuram and Chennai). Many parents come to the school to cheer their wards and participate in the bonhomie.

The venue and food expenses are completely sponsored by Sevalaya.

Sevalaya won the overall championship this year.

# PASAM train friends: supporters for 17 years

PASAM is the acronym of Pattabiram, Avadi Siding, Annanur and Mitnamalle all neighbouring stations. PASAM train friends is a group of 35 passengers who have been commuting between these stations and Chennai Central for years and became friends.

They decided to give a part of the money collected to orphanages.

They heard about Sevalaya and invited the resident children and elders for Aayudha Pooja celebrations. Since then the children and elders are regularly invited for the function every year. The association also gives gifts to the children during the occasion.

Says S Kumaran who has been in this association since its beginning, "We tried to invite another NGO but they were only focussed on money. Sevalaya is the only NGO which understands

us and thinks about the good of the children rather than money. All the Sevalaya children come with smiling faces and are very disciplined. The local people willingly donate money when Sevalaya is mentioned as the beneficiary, in the posters we put out."



### **MANAGING TRUSTEE'S REPORT**



Dear Friends,

Thank you very much for all your support to Sevalaya in the past 29 years. Thanks to your continued support, the organization has grown from a humble beginning of five children, and a staff of two in a rented hut in a small village to 2,058 children in a higher secondary school, 173 kids in the children home, 80 senior citizens in the old age home, 70 dry cows in the Gaushala, a free 12 bedded hospital, daily medical camps covering 40 villages, 5 community colleges, 3 organic farms and a team of 175 staff - covering Chennai, Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram and Thanjavur districts in Tamilnadu. This year saw a lot of expansion geographically and in the variety of activities. All this growth has been in response to only one context: the community we had set out to serve. In the year 2016-17, Sevalaya has spent more resources on community development projects than in any previous years. The focus has been holistic, encompassing education, livelihood, healthcare, environment, awareness, sports and culture.

Response to emergency

The 2015 Chennai floods and 2016 Vardah cyclone, kept us busy this year also. Sevalaya built 27 houses,

each costing approximately 3 lacs, for flood victims in Kasuva, Puliyur and Pakkam villages. This was made possible by the generous support of PwC India Foundation, BNY Mellon, V S Sivakumar, Singapore and Tamil Folks of Lake County, IL, USA. The construction of homes was completed by September 2016, and handed over to the beneficiaries. One of the villages is now renamed as "Sevalaya-PwC" nagar.

The 2016 Vardah cyclone created havoc within Sevalaya's Kasuva campus. Trees which were planted 25 years ago were uprooted and the campus resembled a battle field. Also, the trees fell on solar panels, compound walls, and disrupted network and power cables, and a cellphone tower causing extensive damage totalling an estimated 30 lacs. Immediate help came from L&T Infotech, Page Pierre & family, Prof. S Swaminathan and family, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Samithi, Besant Nagar and many others. Within two months all repair work was carried out and we were back to normal, except for the trees. When we found out that at least 3,000 trees were damaged or uprooted in and around our Kasuva campus, we started a vigorous campaign to plant trees. The project was supported by PwC India Foundation, BNY Mellon, L&T

Infotech, and many individual donors. Volunteers from corporate institutions took part in planting the trees.

Many people lost their livelihood during the natural disasters and Sevalaya helped by donating hundreds of tailoring machines to affected families which helped them restart their lives. These machines were sponsored by Capgemini, L&T Infotech, and individual donors like Seshadri Sundaram & friends, V Kumaraswamy and S Rangarajan & friends.

### **Expansion**

Sevalaya has been producing skilled man power from its Kasuva and Vadanallur community colleges. One more centre came up in Mambakkam this year which is sponsored by PPG Asian Paints. Two centres were started in Ambattur - one sponsored by L&T Infotech and the other by Ambattur Clothing Private limited, thus taking the total count of community colleges to five. Hot breads and Jouve India are our technical partners. Technocrat, G Solutions, ACPL, Sunmeister, Usui Susira, Teja hospital, RR Engineers, Portea provide employment to successful students.

Apart from Kasuva centre, this year Sevalaya started organic farming in two other locations. Land at Thirumalaivaiyavur was donated by Ambattur Clothing Pvt Ltd and Sevalaya started organic farming activities there. Another donor D V Sridharan has allowed us to use his land in Madhuranthakam. Sevalaya is able to organically produce pumpkins, groundnuts, and vegetables in these fields, which are used in Kasuva kitchen, for consumption by children and senior citizens.

### **New activities**

Many new activities were added to our current operations.


A mobile medical unit, sponsored by BNY Mellon visits two villages every day. In each camp, around 100 villagers are treated free of cost. A medical team, consisting of a doctor and two nursing assistants and Sevalaya staff is engaged in rendering mobile medical services. BNY Mellon also sponsors a nursing assistant course in Kasuva community college. So far two batches of around 20 girls per




Montessori children at their library (above) and in the class room

batch have completed the course and all 40 of them have been placed in various hospitals around Thiruninravur. Sevalaya's medical centre and the mobile medical services provide the training ground for the nursing assistants.

State Bank of India donated a school bus. This bus and the one donated by Gurukrupa Foundation make multiple trips to bring all the kindergarten kids to school.

Page Pierre Foundation sponsored the construction of a huge Montessori hall and Asian Paints sponsored Montessori kits. This hall can easily accommodate 150 children at a time and it is a visual treat to watch the tiny tots (in the 3-5 age group) completely absorbed in playing and learning with the Montessori kits.

With the support from Asian Paints, Sevalaya installed water ATMs, and many water doctors so that villagers and school children in village schools get access to pure drinking water. Sevalaya also organized many tree planting and tank cleaning activities. With support from Shell India, Sevalaya distributed 900 environment friendly bio-mass stoves to villagers, to rid the kitchens of dangerous smoke. Sevalaya made paper bags, cloth bags and distributed them free to visitors and donors, as an alternative to plastic bags.

With support from Page Pierre
Foundation, Sevalaya implemented
"Swacch Sevalaya" scheme. Three
colour coded dust bins are placed in
many areas in Kasuva campus and
children are taught to segregate waste
and dispose them in the different
colored dust bins. The waste is
collected and segregated each week.
Bio degradable waste is composted and
used as natural manure, while
non-degradable waste is recycled as
scrap.

With support from L&T Infotech, Sevalaya took up the project of digitization of Gandhian books at Gandhi Study Centre, T.Nagar. Nearly one lac (1,00,000) pages of Gandhian books are digitized under this project. These books will be uploaded to the Gandhi study Centre website and it will be available for all, online. This project was taken up after we realized post the floods that many rare books were lost.

On 8th November, 2016, the Central Government announced the demonetisation of high value currency notes, and move transactions online, to curb black money and counterfeit note menace. The uneducated village women folk were put to great hardship as they did not understand how to use online methods. Sevalaya sprang into action and sent it's staff as volunteers to help village customers waiting in Indian Bank and State Bank of India branches at Thiruninravur. Sevalaya invited village women to listen to bankers explaining the online process. Nearly 1,000 women turned up and the Sevalaya auditorium was overflowing. Manager and staff from State Bank of India explained how to convert one's mobile phone into a bank branch.

3 eye camps per month are held with support from Standard Chartered-GBS. Dental, ENT, Cancer detection, skin, Hepatitis B, Physiotherapy and Liver camps were also arranged from time to time and villagers got expert services free. Apollo Hospitals under the Apollo Aushad Programme donates free medicines for old age home every month.

In all community colleges, evening tuition centres are helping under privileged children understand their lessons better. As the parents of such children are mostly uneducated, the children need support after school to complete their homework and prepare for the next day. These community colleges are also equipped with good library facilities, where children can read general books. Mobile libraries were set up in 10 Government schools to enable the students to get access to good books.

### Improvements to ongoing activities

During the year, many ongoing activities saw remarkable improvements.

Education sponsorship got a boost as many corporate institutions came forward to sponsor the education of children. Standard Chartered GBS, GRT Jewellers, CAMS, SPi Global and Asian Paints supported us in the cause. Many individual donors also contributed their mite.

Kitchen got additional space – a separate wash area for vessels, proper system to drain the waste water from kitchen and dining hall and a shed



in the hand wash area thanks to SPi Global and Shell India. Our Basketball court which needed improvements and relaying of the floor got support from BNY Mellon and Shell India. Now Sevalaya has a world class basketball court.

Sevalaya's award winning moral education (BGV) is now taken to various schools all over Tamil Nadu. Our staff visit schools as far as Rameswaram, and take classes on Bharathi – Gandhi – Vivekananda (BGV). This activity is sponsored by Mara Breech Foundation, USA.

English is a weak link for village children. So Sevalaya decided to pay special attention to English coaching. AON sponsored the "English helper" program and Lionbridge sponsored the spoken English program. Edustrokes, an English language teaching module, designed by British council and Kris Srikkanth, former captain of Indian cricket team, is sponsored by Coca cola. "Karadi path", an innovative language learning process, especially English is sponsored by Dikpala.

Students who complete Std XII successfully from Sevalaya, find it difficult to pursue higher education in universities. Sevalaya was successful in getting support for this cause from BNY Mellon. They have sponsored the higher education of 37 students. Sevalaya also encourages its staff to equip themselves with better qualification. Many staff join higher education and the course fees are arranged through Mara Breech Foundation, USA.

Continuous improvement is a key factor in Sevalaya. This year Sevalaya has taken up implementation of "5S" model of work culture improvement. T M Venkatesan, Chairman and Mentor of Hyderabad based Training Institute Focus 5 and his team are providing the training and support, free of cost.

With many women empowerment programmes in the last couple of years, Sevalaya is invited by many corporate institutions to celebrate Women's Day. L&T infotech invited women trainees from all our community colleges to their office and had a day long program to explain about leadership and fiscal responsibility. Lionbridge invited girl children for a cultural programme

to cater to 2,000 children. Now the school is operating at optimum capacity and Sevalaya is not able to admit any more, despite a huge demand. The management has started thinking about another school, maybe to house another 2,000 children.

Sevalaya is successfully managing five community colleges now. Our aim is to expand it to ten community colleges. We plan to add more courses like Bakery, cell phone/TV service and get into hospitality services too.

Hospital services and mobile medical services are available in Kasuva village now. There is a plan to expand these into Kanchipuram district also. The Kasuva hospital need to be upgraded to do X-ray, ECG, blood test etc. free of cost to poor villagers.

Sevalaya is planning to do more community development projects including – village development, water atms, pond cleaning and running of supplementary education centres.

Sevalaya would like to increase its presence all over Tamil Nadu. As a first step, a free old age home is planned in Thanjavur. Providing free breakfast for

poor school children in Thanjavur is also in the plan.

Keeping pace with technology and to take advantage of digital advancements, Sevalaya is planning for a technology enabled campus where all systems at all locations will be connected and all operations will go online.




