Renault Nissan funds ₹1 crore for Pediatric Ward Renovation

The renovated Pediatric Intensive Care Ward at the Government General Hospital, Chengalpet was inaugurated on 6th March 2023 by Ma Subramanian, Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare and T M Anbarasan, Hon'ble Minister for Rural Industries, Cottage Industries, Small Industries, Slum clearance board, Govt. of Tamil Nadu.

The main objective of the project was to reduce infant and under-five mortality

rates in the districts the facility serves, in line with WHO norms.

The Pediatric department at Chengalpet Government Hospital faced inadequate infrastructure to handle the increasing number of patients. It has 2 units with 40 beds per unit and a PICU with 10 beds, catering to critically ill children

who have been referred from both government and private hospitals in Chengalpet, Kanchipuram, Villupuram, and Thiruvannamalai districts. With an average of 50 children per month requiring support, the hospital had only 10 ventilators.

The project entailed expanding PICU capacity from 10 to 15, installing 10 sophisticated bed heads and central air handling unit (6.27 Cu M), as also civil works such as changing windows and flooring, putting in place a central monitoring system and augmenting bed space, among other things.

medals- 238, Silver medals- 238, Bronze medals- 124).

6 Students from Std VII to IX won individual championships.

The Vivekananda team got 300 points and won the overall Championship in the event. The Bharathiyar team earned 214 points and the Gandhi team earned 203 points.

Rathna was born eldest of 4 children to a migrant couple from Palghat. She was a 7-year-old when Chennai got its TV station in 1975. From radio to TV was a dazzling switch! Then her family used to live in Mannadi, characterised by swathes of small houses. There'll be one house with a TV set. All were welcome! Seated on a crowded floor, she watched moving images with amazement. She was also exposed to news telecast. Her favourite was Shobana Ravi, the star tamil newsreader. The way she spoke, her body language, her pronunciation, the way she conducted herself – Ratna took in all that with adulation and admiration. "I should be doing this one day", young Rathna decided. Visiting relatives, on being asked what she wanted to become, she would say, "I'm OK in studies, but I will become a newsreader". No one took her seriously. In fact, her mother advised her to do

something more serious in her life.

The only encouragement came from the school teachers who gave her opportunities to read news headlines in the school assembly and used to compliment her on her pleasant voice. Meanwhile, preparing for a traditional job for girls, she did her M.com and ICWAI.

But her heart was in television. Rathna started working in Doordarshan, even as a teenager. Doordarshan was predictable. All artistes adhered to certain norms and a standard style. Then came the opportunity to work in Sun TV. "That opened new doors for me. Sun TV encouraged individuality". Pioneers in telecast media, Sun TV offered a varied bouquet, with varied programmes and personalities. A whole new audience had to be catered to and they loved the offering. One of the most popular programmes Rathna used to anchor was slotted at 8.30 prime time on Fridays.

Rathna has hosted 950 episodes of *Thirai Vimarsanam*, a critique of movies. That programme wielded a lot of power and influence in the film world. "That was a responsibility. I was always careful not to be overtly critical of movies, knowing very well that thousands earned their livelihood from that industry". She cannot put her finger on why she was not attracted to social media. She has kept away from it.

Rathna got married to Aravind

Venkataraman in 1992. The couple have twin children: Anirudh doing B designing in Motion Graphics and dreaming of working in Hollywood, and Advika, doing B.Com, headed for CA.

From 2001 to 2017 Rathna had a flourishing export business. She then switched to hospitality business and runs villas on ECR and service apartments in the city. It takes empathy to run a hospitality business, she says, pointing out the different treatment, different age groups and customer segments expect. With a high 4.8 score, she is rated super host by Air bnb.

Isaikkavi Ramanan has been for long her mentor and guide. In 2010 during one of his lectures, she was introduced to Sevalaya Murali. "Iam Amazed at the activities of Sevalaya", she says. "Then I met Bhuvana and her father TSV Sir. He is truly inspirational".

"I've always had empathy and have used opportunities to help the deprived. I am just sharing what I got from God. Giving gives a lot of peace and joy. The more I give, the more God has given me, enriched me and blessed my family", says Rathna.

Thillaiyadi Valliammai - (9)

The first day of the journey went off well. Valliamma's mind was however preoccupied with the rigours of the epic journey and the outcome of the mission.

In most of the towns that they passed through, the Indian merchants provided them with food and accommodation displaying the legendary Indian custom of hospitality and concern for travellers.

At night Valliamma cried when she listened to the sounds of rumbling tummies and watched the women moistening their parched lips as they ran their dry tongues into their mouths. She got up often and checked that the Satyagrahis were resting albeit for a short periods, before settling down for a brief respite.

Over the next few days, drunken pseudo officials cruelly harassed them. The rude men asked for their permits and were met with cold stares and a deafening silence. When one of the men said that they would be arrested if they did not produce their permits, Valliamma sternly replied that they would not produce permits nor would they treat. She challenged him to arrest them if they could. She also refused to pay the bribe

that they demanded for not taking action against them. The tormentor angrily retorted threatening to return with reinforcements. They just stepped back and never returned.

They stumbled into Vereeniging, some stumbling and nursing their soles by wrapping rags around them. Two of the young women and dragged their feet, their arm hugging their chests and their eyes moist. They had both lost their children and were mourning in silence. Others just pushed on, ignoring the excruciating pain and hunger pangs.

Valliamma consoled them. "Freedom is our birth right, but we have to fight for it. Nobody hands it to you like a lotus flower. When Mr Kallenbach, a white man, who is sympathetic to our cause, can march with us, as he has done oftenand he is not the only white person to do so - it motivates us and adds to our determination. If we don't stand up for it now, the generations to come will still be suffering under the unjust laws. The price that we pay today will free those that come after. And it is a lot by comparison. And you can't place a value on it."

This is the oration of Valliamma as

narrated by the author of "Agony of Valliamma"

The comrades positively responded to her emotional speech.

Valliamma announced to the group that they were approaching NewCastle. She added that they had survived by then, and if only they could manage to talk to only one group of labourers, just the miners and the railway workers, they would be succeeding in getting them to strike work. Others would automatically

Even as they were discussing, one gentleman approached them, and introduced himself as Dawood Mohamed. He belonged to a group of passive resisters, and they were expecting the marchers. They had received a message that the team was on its way. He offered to take them to the people of New Castle. Dawood



told her that everything has been arranged for them to stay and refresh themselves. There were also a hakim who were passive resisters.




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
