

KONE funds ₹70 lacs Thathanur Model Village project

Thathanur village in Sriperambudur, Kanchipuram District is the scene of some vital transformation, kicked in by a Model Village project nearing completion. Sponsored at a cost of around ₹70 lacs, is funded by KONE Elevators & Escalators India Private Limited, with Sevalaya as the implementation partner.

These facilities were inaugurated at a function at Thathanur village on 12th April 2023. Ragu Gunabooshanam,

Director-Finance, KONE Elevators was the Chief Guest. He promised his company's support for more such worthy CSR projects.

Among the facilities added are a Medical Centre, a Tuition Centre, a Community Toilet block and an RO plant.

The Medical centre will function from 2 to 5pm on weekdays providing free consultations and medicines to the

villagers. That will save considerable time compared to the alternative of visiting Sriperambudur.

The Tuition Centre will provide free support to the government students studying from Std I to VIII. Snacks will be provided to the students. This centre will function from Monday to Saturday, 5 to 7pm. Nearly 150+ students in and around Thathanur village are expected to be benefitted.

10 Community toilets each for men and women have been constructed in the village of Kalmedu nagar, Thathanur. 300+ villagers and 56 School students can access the toilet.

An RO plant has also been installed, promising clean water to 1,200+ villagers.

In all, over 1,500 villagers in and around Thathanur village, stand to benefit from these facilities.

Thillaiyadi Valliammai - (10)

Dawood Mahomed cautioned her that they should be prepared to face the worst. The police might harass and even arrest them. At a point while they were talking and walking, the benefactor told them that they had reached their destination.

Valliamma and her companions were thrilled. They had not expected such a large crowd waiting for them. The merchants in new castle together with their wives and families, took the women to their homes and even had pitched some comfortable tents in their backyards. The crusaders were treated like heroes and were fed sumptuously.

The ladies warned the group to be cautious They had heard that Fatima, the wife of Sheik Mehtab, a close friend of Gandhiji, together with her seven year old son was arrested in Volkrust. They were treated roughly and nobody knew where they were kept. There were other similar incidents. Valliamma's valiant response was summed by the author in the book "Agony of Valliamma"

"Our people are dying every day. On our journey, we lost several little children. One infant froze to death. Another just

fell out of his exhausted mother's arms when she was going across a river. A little girl, tired and freezing in the cold, with nothing to keep her warm, toppled on the wayside and we had to carry her on a rough stretcher to the nearest store. The merchant's wife took her into her own home, and we were forced to leave her there."

"And yet, no one thought of going back. We were single minded in continuing our mission. Death is just a short interlude. The struggle goes on till the victory is ours! And I assure you, we will win! The move is on and it is unstoppable! It is simply a matter of time."

Valliamma and her group were awe struck. They could not believe their eyes. More than a thousand workers, men and women, had turned out to hear the crusaders. Their anger was reflected in their faces as they stood stiffly in tight little knots and silently waited to be addressed.

Valliamma consolidated her thoughts. She and her comrades could only give them a message. They could not free them. The workers were the only ones who could fight to escape from their bondage. They

had to be made to understand that they had the power to break their bondage and free themselves. She mentally struggled. She had to ask them to demand their god given and legitimate entitlement and restore their dignity. They had been down trodden for long enough. It was time that they defied their task masters who far too long had been tyrannising them.

She straightened up, raised her right hand, as if taking an oath and shouted, her voice reverberating off the mine dumps, and the sound was echoed over the valley.

"Shatham Prathi Satyam" - Truth against arogue. A thousand voices echoedher cry, fists pointed at the sky, their faces reflecting their anger.


