TN Minister inaugurates Sevalaya's 20th Centre, at Thillaiyadi

Honouring the legacy of Valliammai

Sevalaya's Thillaiyadi Valliammai Medical Centre and Mobile Medical services were inaugurated at Thillaiyadi village by Ma Subramanian, Honourable Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Government of Tamil Nadu on 27th January 2023.

The Medical Centre with a full-time doctor and a nurse will provide medical services to villagers numbering over 5,000. The Mobile Medical Van sponsored by DTCC will be visiting the nearby villages, taking health care to the doorsteps of the needy.

The Honorable Minister appreciated Sevalaya's decision to open the Medical Centre in Thillaiyadi and expressed the hope that it would grow into a multispecialty hospital. He also assured support for Sevalaya's future initiatives.

Sevalaya Murali, Founder & Managing Trustee of Sevalaya, recounted the sacrifices made by Thillaiyadi Valliammai in her short life for 16 years, during the Satyagraha in South Africa under the leadership of Gandhiji.

"This health initiative is a way for us to honour her memory and continue her work of fighting for the rights and wellbeing of women and young girls.", he

Menstrual Hygiene Awareness

Thillaiyadi Valliammai: A Freedom Fighter and a Symbol of Empowerment



Thillaiyadi
Valliammai was a
prominent figure
in the Satyagraha
movement in South
Africa, spearheaded
by Gandhiji. She
is known for her
contributions

to the empowerment of the Indian community there. Her parents are from Thillaiyadi, a small village in the present Mayilauthurai District in TamilNadu. They migrated to South Africa. Valliammai was born in South Africa and had never been to India, in her short span of life but is popularly known as Thillaiyadi Valliammai. Inspired by Mahatma Gandhi, she

actively participated in the Satyagraha Movement in South Africa under his leadership, fighting for the empowerment of Indian Community there. She was imprisoned several times during the freedom struggle. Due to the harsh treatment in prison, her health deteriorated and she died at the age of 16.

An excerpt from Gandhiji's book 'Satyagraha in South Africa' about Valliammai.

"Valliamma R. Munuswami Mudaliar was a young girl of Johannesburg only sixteen years of age. She was confined to bed when I saw her. As she was a tall girl, her emaciated body was a terrible thing to behold.

'Valliamma, you do not repent of your having gone to jail?' I asked.

'Repent? I am even now ready to go to jail again if I am arrested,' said Valliamma.

"But what if it results in your death?' I pursued.

'I do not mind it. Who would not love to die for one's motherland?' was the reply.

"Within a few days after this conversation Valliamma was no more with us in the flesh, but she left us the heritage of an immortal name.... And the name of Valliamma will live in the history of South African Satyagraha as long as India lives".

Haworth funds two CSR projects at Kiloy village

A Community College and a physiotherapy unit were added to the comprehensive village development project funded by Haworth India Pvt Ltd

at Kiloy village at Sriperumbudur block, Kanchipuram district. The two additions are worth around ₹19 lakhs, and will benefit 3,000 underprivileged people in and around Kiloy village. Vasudeva Rao Anand, Finance Director, Haworth India, inaugurated both the projects on 11th January 2023.

In his speech, Anand emphasized that by providing education and healthcare services as the implementation partner, Sevalaya is bringing hope to a population that has limited access to these resources. He spoke to the students about the importance of acquiring knowledge and skills to progress in life.

Haworth India has sponsored 8 computers, 10 tailoring machines and other infrastructure materials for the Community college. The Community college will offer basic Computer and tailoring courses to 34 trainees in the 6-months long batch starting from

12th January 2023. The skilling is expected to benefit underprivileged women and youth in and around five villages: Kiloy village, Kiloy colony, Ayakulathoor village, Ayakulathoor colony, and A N Kandigai.

Haworth's project features a community college that offers computer and tailoring courses, as well as a medical centre with a part-time doctor and nurse. The physiotherapy unit, which has recently become operational, includes a part-time physiotherapist and therapy equipment such as a traction machine, interferantial therapy (IFT), infra-red radiation (IRR), shoulder wheel, and quadriceps exercise chair. The project is expected to benefit 3567 villagers from the period, of April 2022 to March 2023.

N Devanandh, Operations Director, Mahendran Balan, Senior Finance Manager and other managers in Haworth India Pvt Ltd also participated.

Kone Elevator launches model village project

An RO plant has also been installed, to provide clean water to villagers. 10 Community toilets, 5 each for men and women have been constructed in the adjoining village of Karunakaracheri.

An education loan saw him through a dual degree in MSc Chemistry and BE Hons. in Electricals and Electronics, at BITS Pilani. The week before the exams his classmates used to assemble in Madhavan's room where he will coach them. He always had a bit of a teacher in him right from the school days and he wanted to do his PhD to become a professor. He did get admission in the New York University but the funds required were beyond his means.

Madhavan started his career with Infosys, Chennai and then moved to Samsung, Bangalore where he worked long enough to wipe out his education loan. In 2008, more loans, to supplement his entire savings, took him to University of Minnesota where he did his MS in Electrical Engineering. He opted to return to India which, in retrospect, proved a blessing: Madhavan lost his father in 2011 and mother in 2013. Both were only around 60 years. "I am so happy I could be with them in the last days", he recalls.

Madhavan has been working in Amazon since 2016. "I have a global job living here in Mylapore where my roots are, where



When Gandhi met Valliamma at her place, she was on to a plan for a bigger action- a greater march. Her protest was to be against the ACT of UNION. The proposal was for making a union of South Africa. She smelt danger in this proposal. It was totally racist and excluded all people of colour from calling themselves the citizens of the country. She was planning for a march to Pretoria, the very next day with her followers who were full of enthusiasm. She knew that she would be jailed, and told Gandhi that she would only be proud to be incarcerated. Gandhi could not resist appreciating her and telling her to her face that her's was the true spirit of Satyagraha.

Gandhi returned to his comrades and narrated the turn of events. They were discussing the indomitable spirit of the girl. Gandhi was telling them that she had never shown any tendency towards violence. Both her parents and she herself all along behaved with strict adherence to his teachings of Satyagraha. He was sure that she would be fighting a good fight—peacefully.

While they were so discussing,

Tshabalala arrived with the news that Valliamma had been arrested. Gandhi and comrades were expressing anxiety about the girl, Tshabalala responded with a chuckle and said that the "child" made his toughest fighters look like cowards. He narrated what happened when she was arrested. She was holding her hands to be cuffed, saying, "What took you so long?"

Gandhi approached Gl.Smuts and made a strong protest against throwing a child of 12 to jail for protesting peacefully. Gl.Smuts expressed his ignorance of the incident and assured to issue instruction to the concerned officials to release her immediately.

Meantime, Valliamma was ruminating in the jail. She had just then attended the funeral of Nagappan who was her associate in all the struggle. He was thrown to jail for questioning the authorities. He was tortured in the prison, and within six days of his release he had died of Pneumonia and heart failure.

"The jail was a filthy place with huge and fat rats biting people. If asking to be treated decently as citizen should be, is a crime for which people should be


punished, then the world was not a good place to live in. If rulers thought that if they do this to me, I will keep my mouth shut and will not tell the people to stand up to them, they are sadly mistaken."

At this juncture, the elderly warden, who was a kindly gentleman entered, opened the door and said smilingly that she had been released.

Gandhi and his comrades were waiting at the gate. To their anxious question whether she was hurt, she replied firmly and with certainty," They can't hurt me. I don't submit to savagery. Now, I need to prepare for the next rally urgently. I have lost already three days in prison."

She also added to their amazement," If in fighting for my people, I have to go to jail, I will do it again and again without regret."
