### Destitute women, tribal children and Sevalaya elders benefit

Japanese multinational Komatsu has come forward to support multiple initiatives with Sevalaya. The company has funded the refurbishment of various facilities at Sevalaya's 30-year-old Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa Old Age Home at Kasuva.

Komatsu has also funded 100 sewing machines for destitute women living near Sunguvarchatram, Kanchipuram District. The third area to benefit from the largesse is education in the predominantly tribal communities of a couple of villages in Gudalur,

Nilgiri district. The implementation partner is Sevalaya Group organisation, Sevalaya Samaritan Gramodharan Samithy which runs a hospital primarily to serve the tribal communities of the region.

### Making elders' life easy

As a part of its CSR initiative, Komatsu sponsored infrastructure support worth around ₹7,00,000 for Sevalaya's old age home at Kasuva village at a function held on 26<sup>th</sup> October 2022.

Hiroshi Shirato, Plant Director, Komatsu India Private Limited gifted 15 steel cots with mattresses, 24 ceiling fans, 57 LED tube lights, 20 steel cupboards, a mixie, 2 water dispensers, a washing machine, 10 flasks, 4 vegetable cutters, 10 hot water kettles and, steel and brass vessels.

# A window for hope, a dream that motivates

What is sports? Is it trying to run the fastest one can? Is it attempting the longest or the highest jump? Or, is it throwing the shot or javelin the farthest?

For orphaned girls such as Akshaya and Pavithra, sports is a lot more than defying the force of gravity.



For someone who doesn't know her parents, it is remarkable that her smile never leaves S Akshaya. Her earliest memories are about her childhood in a hostel. Five years back, that hostel was shut down and Akshaya was among the girls shifted to Sevalaya home for girls, at Kasuva. She was in the 5th Standard then. She joined other girls in the basketball court and soon picked up the game. She showed speed and ball handling skills. Soon, just into her teens, she was so good that she was part of the School under-19 team. She made up for her lack of height with accurate long shots and clever passing.

Athletics coach V Nithyanandam noticed Akshaya's skills. And introduced her to pole vault. Thanks to a generous sponsorship of Hatley, Sevalaya now had access to equipment for different jumps. The lockdown period robbed her and other athletes many months of practice.

To make up, parallelly with basketball, she started investing more time in athletics practice. Akshaya was a member of the School's 4x400 meters relay team that won at the Zonal competition. This small built girl topped in pole vault at the District competitions, in under 15. With the State competition in mind, she now focuses on her individual event of pole vault, strengthening her

shoulders, spending time at the Gym. Her coach believes she can improve a lot by improving shoulder strength and technique.

She has a child's dream of playing Olympics in Basketball, unaware of India's world ranking. Her mission in life is lot more real and praiseworthy: coach disadvantaged children like herself.



M Pavithra, along with her younger brother M Vignesh, joined Sevalaya in 2018. They do not remember their parents. They were both in a hostel in Thirumullaivayil that was closed down. They were both in the 9<sup>th</sup> Standard, when they were shifted to Sevalaya by the Child Welfare Committee.

That changed things for both. In the compulsory sports hours, Pavithra picked up handball. Vignesh liked Volley ball. She grew tall to reach the current 175 cms.

She is 18 years, promising more height. Coach Nithyanandam 'discovered' her and introduced her to shot put and discus throws. Improving rapidly, Pavithra ended with silver in shot put at the District meet. She is also a member of the under 19 handball team of Sevalaya that will play at the State meet.

Unlike earlier days when she was a late riser, now she is up and ready for practice at 5.30 am. Nearly 3 hours of daily action

has improved her appetite. Her great joy is to share with Vignesh their successes on the sports field. Of course, the brother and the sister encourage each other by saying that sports will help them get over a life with little else that cheers. She is overcome by emotions when she narrates this.

Pavithra has grown in confidence. She wants to become an IPS.

To Akshaya and Pavithra, sports is an elevator to exit the cruelty of fate. Sports promises freedom from a pitiable childhood. A window for hope. A dream that motivates. Both Akshaya and Pavithra are headed for the Tamilnadu State meet.

No small achievement by two destitute girls!

Sevalaya's sports talent search and nurturing programme, supervised by Physical Director A Sankarapandian, now supported by Sevalaya alumni and Asst Coach G Kavitha, has been greatly benefited by some thoughtful support.

The Gym, which has improved fitness and strength of the athletes, was sponsored by Petrofac Engineering Services in 2018. With Matexnet sponsoring Coaches for Athletics, Handball, Basketball and Volleyball, from April 2022, Sevalaya sports got another fillip. Hearing of the incident, P.K.Naidoo and Thambi Naidoo were worried as to what would befall Valliamma. At this juncture news came to them that the policeman with whom Valliamma had an encounter came to her house an hour ago with a large number of people and was screaming for her. She was not at home and they had taken her parents away. The Naidoos were worried what would Valliamma do next. They must find her and take Gandhi to go with them to the Police Station.

When Valliamma entered the house, she found it was wide open and nobody was there. The neighbours told her that her parents were treated rudely and were taken away by a gang of ruffians. Meantime, Thambi Naidoo, Gandhi and H O Ally arrived on the scene told her that it was the police who had taken her parents away. The trio were proceeding to the police station and that she could accompany them.


At the Police Station, Gandhi was polite but assertive in his discussion with the officials. They had illegally detained an innocent couple and the repercussion would be bad. With a view to avoiding collision, he advised them to release them, as otherwise he would be constrained to escalate the matter to General Smuts. The officials knew Gandhi's influence with General Smuts. Having no other option, they released the

Valliamma had an aside with the comrades and told them that the official to whom Gandhi was talking courteously was the one who beat up the old man. She was none too pleased with the pacific stance of Gandhi. She expressed her view that some firm steps had to be taken to stop the menace. The three appreciated her firm determination. They had also noted her approach was non-violent and Dharmic. It was because of her parents, the Moodliars, who were active passive resisters. Gandhi, the Kaliyuga Yudhishtra he was, told her "Their Karma will manifest itself in the years to come." Valliamma could not resist firmly telling him, "I am not prepared to suffer until someday their Karma catches up with them. The time is now. I am their Karma, and now I am knocking on their door."

Valliamma was walking along in a lonely road in Johannesburg. She had a hunch

that somebody was following her. Before she could react, the Policeman from whom she had earlier rescued Amod, confronted her. He gave her a hard slap. Blood was dripping down from her upper lip down the cheek. The attacker was grinning with delight, his fingers bunching as he readied himself for the next blow. 
