A book an 11-year-old borrowed from a neighbour, had a turbaned face with a beard and a fierce pair of eyes, on the cover. Randomly opening a page, he read:

There is nothing holier than providing education to the poor.

The more he read, even more deeply was he impressed by the idealism and the reformist ideas of Mahakavi Bharathiyar. Along with Gandhiji and Swami Vivekananda, the revolutionary poet became an inspiration behind the founding of Sevalaya in 1988.

The opening of Ravanasamudram Centre in 2018 opened the eyes of Sevalaya Founder V Muralidharan, to the utter neglect of neighbouring Kadayam, the birth place of Bharathiyar's wife Chellamma. It was at Kadayam where the poet had spent 2 years towards the end of his life and penned immortal poems. It was at Kadayam where Bharathiyar was out casted for his ahead-ofthe-times ideas on gender equality, attracting the ire of the villagers ... how dare he put his hand on the shoulder of his young wife and walk in public?

A monument there, to honour the memory of the couple, became an obsession with him. A statue of the couple was made ready in 2019, the 122nd anniversary year of their marriage. But land and permission to erect the statue was delayed for over three years due to red tapism. That long-cherished wish of the Sevalaya family has just come true: the Chellamma Bharathi Learning Centre, where stood a dilapidated Government Library.

Built with a lot of passion by Sevalaya, with the participation of so many admirers of the social reformer.



Pattinappakkam – Sevalaya's 11th Community College

Thanks to the vision and benevolence of an ex Banker, Sevalaya has a presence close to Chennai's famous Marina beach

Last December, Sevalaya got a New Year gift, with the ownership transfer of a two-story building at Pattinampakkam along with a vocational training centre, not very far from Chennai's showpiece, Marina beach. It is Sevalaya's 11th Community college (vocational training centre), thanks to the vision and benevolence of K. Balasubramanian.


A successful banker with American Express for more than two decades, serving in South East Asia and Europe, Balasubramanian took an early retirement and returned to Chennai in 1997, to be with aged parents. After stints with the GMR Group and as CEO of the ING Vysya Bank, he relinquished all his corporate responsibilities and started a Trust in 2017. "God has been kind to me, so I wanted to give back to society". It won't be dole, but skills to earn a livelihood, he was clear, based on his insight from heading the GMR Foundation. He identified the Slum Clearance Board settlements which houses the Tsunami-affected fishermen families and others. The Trust took on lease a Government land with a broken down school building and built a two storey building and furnished it,

spending around ₹ 45 lacs. The Trust ran 3-month-long courses in Computers, Mobile phone repair, Tally Accounting, AC and Fridge Repair, Tailoring, Embroidery and Beautician, benefiting an estimated 1,000 women and young men. Then came COVID, and the classes had to be stopped.

That intermission gave an opportunity for Balasubramanian to take a hard look at things. "Age was catching up with me, and I realised I needed external help to run the show", recalls this sprightly octogenarian. He considered a couple of NGOs, and finally chose Sevalaya as caretaker for his dream.





"More than what I need is luxury"

The frugal philosophy of a former Professor and his benevolence give shelter to destitute elders in Sevalaya.

V Ramaswami and V Manoharan were born 12 years apart, to illiterate parents in an impoverished family of weavers in Pondichery. In sheer desperation, their father, Vengatraya Chettiar shifted to buying paddy, boiling it, drying it and then getting rice, which, his wife Nachiar Ammal will sell in retail, to keep the family alive. V Ramaswami, the first boy studied, finished his BSc B Ed, and became a teacher. He took it upon himself to teach his younger brother V Manoharan, who did his BSc, then MSc in Agriculture, followed it up with a PhD in Plant breeding and Genetics. His entire career was devoted to research, working in the field from 7 am to 1 pm, then another three hours in office work. During those 34 years of hard work, Manoharan developed four new varieties of groundnut, three varieties of gingelly and one moth bean variety. Post his retirement, he settled down in Puducherry, to a quiet life.


Introduced to Sevalaya via Youtube, Manoharan visited Sevalaya's Kasuva Centre and "was very happy to find a self sufficient community, with a school, an orphanage, an hospital, a library, play grounds and even a gaushala!".

The sudden demise of his wife V T Shanthi in 2013 further defined his simple attitude to life. An early influence was his elder brother who took care of Manoharan's entire education. "A teacher with a low salary, his brother Ramaswami used to donate ₹ 30 every month, for an orphanage in Chengalpet. "I do not need any luxury. My pension will do for me. Anything extra was



luxury to me", explains Manoharan. He decided to create a lasting monument to perpetuate the memory of his parents and another one in his wife Shanthi's name. Convinced that Sevalaya could help him realise his dream, he donated ₹ 25 lacs for the ongoing construction of Sevalaya's old age home at Zamin Endathur.

Manoharan had built a two storey house at Dharmapuri, his wife's native place, in 2004. He decided to donate that house to Sevalaya. In no time, Sevalaya started an old age home there, enough to shelter 20 elders. "I am so happy the house is put to good use!", he says.

SEVALAYA ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22

It is a huge irony that the two years of lockdown taught the teachers and students of Sevalaya's school in rural Kasuva quite a bit in technology.

With lock down descending without warning like a dark cloud, the first instinctive concern of the school authorities was: how to keep the classes going, online.

There was no escaping the socio economic realities: only 40% of these students had phones at home. Parents were spoken to by teachers, late into the night, even 9 pm, the time parents on subsistence vocations were home. Families of another 20% children got their first smart phones. The school started a campaign and collected used and new phones as donation and distributed to children. A US-based group of school children donated 30 ipads and funded the connectivity.

In some villages, students came together to share the available smart phones. Some 30% missed the classes. ₹600 for 80 days of data was not easy for parents, many of them farm labour. Nearly a third of Sevalaya's students remained on the deprived side of the digital divide, not receiving the inputs. The parents were supportive. Says X Vincent, a farm labourer and father of Sowmiya, 12 B: "Sevalaya teachers took sincere efforts in teaching these children during the lock down period". Her Classmate Mahalakshmi did not have a smartphone and she agonized over losing one year of her life. Then she was thrilled to get a phone worth ₹ 10,000, lent by the School. "When I was in financial debt, Sevalaya helped my daughter by providing the smart phone, so she could attend online classes", says M Shanmugam, her father.

Teachers would send the study materials and questions. The children would access it only in the evening when their parents got back from work. The next day they would respond. By the time the Government revision tests for Std X and XII came, WhatsApp had become the medium. Children learnt to convert answer sheets into PDF and send to teachers. Evaluating so many pages was not easy, with each student's papers taking over half an hour.

"Without the help of Dinesh Sir (extreme left), we would have entered college without knowing the basics!, The e-coaching in Chemistry, Physics and Biology, was very useful. Many of us should get over 95% in the 12th exam and get into professional courses!

Sevalaya got back to contests in 2021. Children have participated in online dance and music. Children won two prices in speech contest conducted by *Kambar Kazhagam*, Chrompet and at the Chennai Book Fair.

Only in sports, it has been a long time out!

With the new-found access to technology, they learnt PPT, google forms, screen shots, the works. The mobile phone empowered them!

B Dinesh Kumar, the Physics teacher, came up with a new method. He shot around 50 videos: he drew out diagrams and derivations, took live videos of that and then added voice over. Each became a short 9 to 10 minute lecture. Each took him close to half an hour. His students were relieved and delighted. Unlike in live lectures, they could replay them again and again, till they were clear. The videos also side-stepped the problem of bad net and audio quality. He kept an open line with the students of Std XII. They would call him anytime, even as early as 4:30 am to 9:00 pm, whenever the students had access to phone, before the parents left for work or after they returned. Sowmiya' father Vincent would be away from 5:00 am till 7:00 am in the morning, and then from 10:am till 3:00 pm.

"Without Dinesh Sir's help, we would have entered college without knowing the basics!", notes Sowmiya. They are grateful to the school for organising e-coaching in Chemistry, Physics and Biology, to help in entrance exams to professional courses.

Many of them are confident of scoring over 95% in the Std XII exam and getting into professional colleges including medicine!

Smart boards: a new dose of energy in classes

"Me Miss", "Me Miss"... children lunge forward, putting up their hands, to solve problems on smart board, enjoying their power over the magic surface that throws up cartoons, colour and movement.

Lockdown brought up Google Meet as a means to conduct classes.. Poor net connectivity in the rural geography affected the teachers. So they took turns, using the couple of projectors and the school net. That is when the School leaders saw an advertisement for smart boards.

Software AG Solutions reacted positively to the appeal and sponsored two smart boards, early 2021. The boards came with teaching software for all classes, with the concept of learning by doing.

Haworth India Pvt. Ltd. saw the enthusiasm among the students, and sponsored 11 smart boards for the primary school classes in the new building.

Lockdown over, students are back,

seeing friends after over two years! And in lower classes, seeing classmates – and the school itself - for the first time!

"The screen is much bigger than TV", reacts Monisha S from Std V B. "Here we can Google search, learn a lot of things. We also have games. Here I am like the remote, can control things". "It is like our phone. We can fully control it", amplifies her classmate Yuvasri T, emphasizing the power over the magic screen.

From KG classes to Std V, smart boards are a big hit. Even the normally withdrawn and reserved kids are appealing to the teacher, to be called to use the smart board. For the teachers too, the fatigue is less, compared to speaking loudly for six hours daily. "Previously, we just couldn't get some children to open their mouths. Now I have to quieten the class when every one shouts, to be called to do exercises on the smart board", says P Nagalakshmi, Teacher of Std I.

An awareness programme to help adolescent girls cope with physiological changes hygienically, and keeping their self- image and self confidence intact

Sevalaya partnered two progressive corporates, to conduct awareness camps on menstrual hygiene. The programme was kicked off end February 2022, in collaboration with Amruthanjan. Funding from PPG Asian Paints enabled its extension, in March, 2022.

Over 3,000 adolescent girls could be reached, including 537 Sevalaya

girls and around 2,500 girls from 12 Government schools.

One-hour long sessions covered the science behind menstruation, the many superstitious beliefs and how to get over natural inhibitions. A lady doctor and a team of nurses interacted with the girls, in privacy. To enable the girls practice the learning easily, customdesigned Sanitary kit were given to


Managing Trustee's Report

The world was limping back to normalcy as Sevalaya completed 34 years in the service of the underprivileged children, elders, women and youth and animals. There was a sigh of relief as the pandemic came under control thanks to the dedicated vaccination campaigns across the world: yes; there were new variants but not as severe and as fatal as in the previous year. Worldwide, the economic downturn has been debilitating. People are still reeling under the aftermath. Many have lost jobs. There are severe pay cuts. Families that lost their breadwinners to COVID are struggling to overcome both the emotional distress caused by the sudden loss and the consequent financial burden.

Sevalaya continued to extend its service to the needy. Pandemic relief operations continued along with the core activities in the fields of education of the poor, welfare of the destitute children and elders, rural development, skill development initiatives for the poor women and youth and shelter for the dry cows.



There was expansion too. Sevalaya started operations in 3 new locations – Pattinampakkam in Chennai, Urapakkam in Kanchipuram and Errapatti in Dharmapuri. In the 34 years of service, our activities have now reached Chennai, Chengalpet, Dharmapuri, Kanchipuram, Nilgiris, Tenkasi, Thanjavur, Thiruvallur, Tiruchirappalli, and Tirunelveli, districts in Tamilnadu and in Puducherry. We run free schools, tuition centres, medical centres, mobile medical services, community colleges, old age homes, organic farms, gaushala, village development projects, and many other services to the orphan and destitute children, rural youth, senior citizens, and animals. Anna Zoological Park, Vandalur, Chengelpet District. Under this project, the moisture in the atmosphere is condensed into water by an Atmospheric Water Generator and Remineralizer and purified to provide pure drinking water to the visitors at 2 water kiosks set up in the Zoo. On a day, the two kiosks produce 2,000 litres of water - sufficient for about 1,000 visitors, staff and animals at the zoo. An identical project has been implemented at Cancer Institute, Guindy, again sponsored by Nissan motors.

- Renault Nissan Automotive India Pvt Ltd (RNAIPL) along with few more corporates sponsored the installation of traffic safety infrastructure at Oragadam, Kancheepuram District. Sevalaya was the implementation partner for RNAIPL, for this project.



Donors

Sevalaya does not receive any Government grant, except for the Integrated Campus project and a portion of children home expense. (Integrated campus project is an initiative of the Social welfare department, Government of Tamilnadu, under which 25 senior citizens and 25 destitute children are housed in one campus. The Government provides a part of the running expense for this activity. Sevalaya was selected by the Government to run this project in the Thiruvallur district). Sevalaya has also been chosen by the District administration to run the reception Home – a short stay home for children who are rescued through Child Helpline, before their cases are heard and either

they are reunited with families or moved to Childrens' Home. However, we do not receive any grant for this project. The Government grant is around 3% of the total budget and the rest 97% comes from donors. Sevalaya continues to run mostly on donations made by well-wishers. These donations which form the lifeblood of the organisation could range from a small one-time amount from an individual to large amounts given regularly by foundations and corporates. The donor could be anyone from a local person who lives a couple of streets away to a Foundation based in the USA or Europe which has heard of and seen the good work being done and the growth achieved by Sevalaya consistently year after year. Sevalaya, on its part, extends its policy of non-discrimination to its donors. Every donor, small or big, has the same place in our heart and receives all periodic communication regarding the activities, successes, financial

Chellamma Bharathi Learning Centre: *Fulfilling a long-cherished dream*

It gives me great pleasure to share with you that Sevalaya is getting closer to achieving its dream of perpetuating the memory of Mahakavi Bharathiyar at Kadayam, the birthplace of his wife Chellamma. It was in Kadayam that the wedding of Bharathi and Chellamma was celebrated on 27th June 1897. It was here that Bharathi lived for a couple of years towards the end of his life. And it was here that he penned many immortal poems.

It all started like this. Impressed by the services of Sevalaya, R S Nallaperumal, an Educationist and a long time donor of Sevalaya, donated his ancestral house in Ravanasamudram, in Tirunelveli District then. He requested that it be used for educational services. Sevalaya decided to start a community college which will offer free training in tailoring and basic computer applications to the poor village women.

I had been to Ravanasamudram for the inauguration of the centre, when a group of youngsters from Kadayam, less than 5 Kms from Ravanasamudram, came to meet me. One of them was Bharathi, a journalist. They told me that years ago, the veteran Congress leader and Tamil scholar Kumari Ananthan, had taken the initiative to celebrate the wedding anniversary of Bharathi - Chellamma at Kadayam, every year. But soon it stopped. Now no one remembers the immortal poet. The youngsters asked me if Sevalaya could revive this celebration.

Mahakavi Bharathi is an inspirer for Sevalaya. He has influenced me since my school days. I felt it an honour to get this opportunity and grabbed it. I immediately said yes and visited Kadayam the same day.

To my utter dismay, there were no signs of Bharathi having lived there. Yes, the people whom I spoke to, mostly in their late eighties, knew about him but remembered him only as a mentally imbalanced person... If this is the case after 100 years of his death - when the whole nation is celebrating him - I shudder to imagine how he would have been treated during his life time.

Unfortunately, this is the fate of geniuses; of people who are ahead of their times; of people who live in their own creative world.

When Bharathi returned from Puducherry, a French Colony then, and entered the then Madras Presidency under British Raj, he was arrested in Villiyanur and placed in the Cuddalore jail. When he was released from jail, he had nowhere to go. It was his brother-in-law Appadurai who offered him shelter at his home in Kadayam. Bharathi was a lover of life. He saw no differences - not just among men but among the entire creation. It was that quality that made him sing, "I am the bird that flies across skies ... "and so on.

This was unbearable for the traditionalists of those days. The

boundaries of interaction among people of various castes/ religions as well as the role of women in society were well defined and rigid. Bharathi defied all these rules – every one of them.

He had Muslim friends from the nearby Pottalpudur village who visited him at his home. The *agraharam* where he lived was aghast at Bharathi inviting them into the house...It was upon the request of these friends that he penned the poetry Allah ... Allah..

He walked up and down in the agraharam streets, with his hands over his wife's shoulder... which was a no-no at that time. Women were never allowed to come out of their houses. They may come out with their husbands but they have to be 10 feet behind them. Woman walking equally alongside a man... even with her husband, was unimaginable.

All these and his "eccentric" ways led to his excommunication from the society. He was not allowed to enter the village. He spent his time at a rock near the Nithyakalyaniamman temple outside the village. It was meted out as a punishment but Bharathi never cared. He was only too happy to be in nature, singing out loud...

The real punishment was for poor Chellamma. Concerned about her husband being alone outside the village and fearing the taunts of the society, she was caught in between. Every day she walked in the hot sun barefoot, carrying food to her husband. And there was Bharathi, playing with the shepherd boys, eating food from the hut dwellers nearby ...

With problems mounting, around the year 1919 – 20, the couple left Kadayam in the middle of the night in haste. And then Bharathi died in September 1921.

Bharathi and his poems never got the recognition rightfully due when he was alive. Slowly, the poet was rediscovered, as it were. Chellamma had preserved Bharathi's writings. They were published. Friends and admirers of Bharathi started writing books/ essays on him. He was getting popular. His poems were nationalised. His songs were used in movies... He was recognised as Mahakavi – the great poet. Memorials were built. Statues were erected in all places connected with his life. In Ettayapuram, where he was born, a Mani mandapam was built. In Kasi, where he spent few years as a student, a statue was erected in front of the house where he lived. There is a statue in Madurai, where he worked in a school for few months. In Puducherry where he spent 10 years in exile, the house where he lived is now a memorial and museum; and there is a statue near the beach. In Chennai, where he spent the last year of his life, the house he lived in Triplicane is a memorial and there is his statue on the Marina Beach.

Sadly, Kadayam is till today missing in this Bharathi map. This illustrious son-in-law of the village was never remembered.

Sevalaya has now taken it upon itself to put Kadayam in the Bharathi map.

As a first step, Sevalaya revived Bharathi Chellamma wedding anniversary celebrations since 2019. We wanted to erect a statue of Bharathi Chellamma in the streets of the *agraharam* where they lived, in the same pose – his

hands over her shoulder, for which he was excommunicated. We applied for Government permission. And waited and waited.... First there was the pandemic. Then the Tirunelveli District where Kadayam village is located got bifurcated came under the jurisdiction of Tenkasi District. The files had to be moved from Tirunelveli to Tenkasi. The red tapism was testing. Meanwhile, the statue was ready. Sculpted by M A Surendranath at his studio in Thiruvallur District, Bharathi and Chellamma were waiting for permission to go to Kadayam!

It was at this juncture that I got the opportunity to meet Appavu, Honourable Speaker of the Tamilnadu Legislative Assembly. He intervened and things started moving. There was response from the District administration. Due to a Government Order, they cannot give permission to install any statue on the road, we were told. They offered an alternate site: a dilapidated old building in disuse, which was earlier a government library. It would have been a dishonour to the poet to install his statue at that site.

And then the plan changed. It grew and expanded. We offered to demolish the dilapidated building and construct a new library building with Bharathi Chellamma statue at the centre. And not just a library, we will create a museum, a digital library, an auditorium to conduct seminars and programmes on Bharathi. Our dreams grew bigger. We visualised a vibrant centre – Chellamma Bharathi Learning Centre with the statue in the middle. The centre will perpetuate the memory of Bharathi in Kadayam, make the younger generation aware of the great poet who lived in their village, remember the illustrious daughter and son in law of the village, and attract Bharathi lovers from all over the world. All this at no cost to the Government. All we needed was their permission and we have got it.


Our Honourable Speaker laid the foundation stone for the building in January 2021. The construction is going on. Our plan is to construct the library in Phase I and install the statue on 27th June 2022, the 125th wedding anniversary of Chellamma - Bharathi.

We decided to bring Chellamma - Bharathi in a royal procession to Kadayam from Thiruvallur in a well decorated ratham. The poet who was once excommunicated for walking in a village street with his hands over his wife's shoulder will now go in a procession in various streets across all districts of Tamilnadu, in the same pose. The *ratham* started its journey from Sevalaya's Kasuva centre on April 17th, 2022 and covered over 3,200 kms in 22 districts of Tamilnadu and Puducherry in 46 days. Hundreds of people - commom man, elected representatives of the people, Ministers MLAs, MPs, industrialists, educationists and media gave a rousing reception to the Chellamma - Bharathi couple. Thousands of children sang his songs, recited his poems, and danced to his songs. Students and youth of villages beat drums, performed Silambam, a traditional martial art, in front of the ratham. Women in villages broke coconuts, lit camphor as they would do for Gods.

The *ratham* reached Kadayam on 1st of June 2022. And the statue will be installed on 27th June 2022.

Our heartfelt gratitude goes to Thiru M Appavu, Honourable Speaker, whose efforts and support, has made this possible.

This is a ₹3 crore project and Sevalaya once again will reach out to the public and donors who have always supported us in all our endeavours, to extend their support to this historic project.

Tamil Nadu pays homage to people's poet

The rich and the poor, the scholars and school children, ministers, MLAs and Mayors, people's representatives and ordinary men, women and children – an estimated 1,00,000 admirers thronged to pay homage to this people's poet. Along a thousand kilo meters across 14 districts of Tamil nadu, Bharathiyar, his hand defiantly resting on Chellamma's slender shoulder, received a warm welcome as his admirers must have recalled his poems that must have impacted them in different phases of their past lives. Over 80 schools and colleges hosted the couple, bedecked in flowers and riding astride a *ratham* (chariot). Over 40,000 students participated at the events, claiming over 2,000 prizes, for poetry recitation, oratory, singing, dancing, drawing and fancy dress. Any open space became the venue for stop overs – bus stands and markets, temples, churches and mosques becoming extempore venues.

There couldn't have been a better demonstration of Bharathi's

egalitarianism than the cross section that greeted him. When the *ratham* reached Manukkula Vinayagar temple in Puducherry, a middle-aged flower seller came with a couple of flower garlands. No, she wasn't trying to sell them. It was her homage to the poet, but she hesitated, saying, "I am only a flower seller". From the third generation of flower sellers attached to that temple, her grandparents might well have known Bharathi, during his 10-year stay at Puducherry.






