# Genesis: realization of a childhood vision

The thought process that later led to the formation of Sevalaya was born when V Muralidharan was 11 years old. While reading a poem by Mahakavi Bharathiyar, he came across an intense verse that said: "There's nothing holier than providing education to the poor". This *mantra* germinated as Sevalaya, which means "Temple of Service".

Around the same time, young Muralidharan used to visit Sri Ramakrishna Math and got inspired by the powerful quotes of Swami Vivekananda. "Even if a dog goes hungry in this world, what is the point in having so many Gods, so many religions, so many temples?" Swami Vivekananda had asked persuasively. The

*mantra* for feeding the hungry later took the shape of homes for the destitute, the poor and the orphans. Another lasting influence on young Muralidharan was Mahatma Gandhi's autobiography, "The story of my experiments with Truth", Gandhiji's vision of villages becoming self-supporting and self-dependent later shaped Sevalaya's blueprint for rural development.

Sevalaya came into being in May 1988. By then, Muralidharan had gained the confidence to do so, having finished his Engineering degree from the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore and spent 4 years in IT industry.

Muralidharan gave up his lucrative and flourishing career with Tata



Consultancy Services in 2009, after completing 25 years in IT industry, to devote full time to Sevalaya.

## Triggering Transformation

Sevalaya has been serving the rural underprivileged communities since 1988. Today, Sevalaya operates at 18 centres in Tamil Nadu (10 districts) and Puducherry.

The first centre of operations is in Kasuva village near Thiruninravur, 45 KMs West of Chennai. Once largely inhabited by brick kiln labourers, whose children often accompanied them, the area has now been transformed into a vibrant community, with child labour totally abolished in Kasuva and over 40+ surrounding villages.

Over the past few years the school strength has topped 2100, more than 50% of them girls. The drop out ratio (those who pass Std XII out of all LKG entrants) is less than 2% and the school pass percentage among this first generation of school goers ranges between 99% to 100%.

Over 2,500 Sevalaya students have passed Std XII since 2005. All of them are either employed or pursuing higher education.

Sevalaya runs a home for 200

destitute children, four old age homes for seniors, two hospitals, a gaushala and 10 community colleges which offer vocational training in 11 trades. 65% of the 3200+ qualified youth are employed and 25% are self employed.

Medical camps, tuition centres and rescue-to-rehabilitation support for victims of natural calamities and the COVID-19 pandemic are part of

Sevalaya's services.

A registered Charitable Trust, Sevalaya renders all its services absolutely free of cost to destitute and needy persons without any discrimination of caste, colour, religion, language, gender or nationality. In this mission, Sevalaya's eternal inspirations are Mahakavi Bharathiyar, Mahatma Gandhi and Swami Vivekananda.

Since 1988, Sevalaya has transformed 40+ villages from 100% child labour to 100% literacy, through quality education given free to 4,700+ rural children, providing higher education for 1,700+ students, housed and shaped the lives of 550+ orphans, given shelter and dignity to 250+ destitute elders, imparted skills and facilitated employment to 4000+ rural youths, reached healthcare to 3,20,000+ poor and needy rural folks, delivered relief, food and medical equipment to benefit over 3,00,000+ people affected by natural calamities and Covid-19 pandemic with your support.

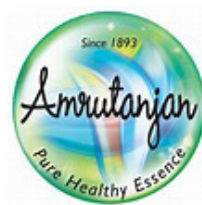

Multi Vitamins tablets were provided to villagers and Vitamin A drops to children below 5 years. 300+ awareness programmes have been conducted since 1994, benefitting 27,125+ teens.

# Projects needing support

## 1. Quality Education

Sevalaya's Mahakavi Bharathiyar Higher Secondary School is a free school with classes from primary up to 12th Std for underprivileged children from the 40 neighboring villages. The children are provided with quality education completely free of cost.

## 2. Livelihood

Sevalaya's Skill Development programme through its community colleges at various locations aims at creating well-trained youth (age 18-30) by providing them with quality vocational training, preparing them for the job market. Courses offered: Computer Skills, Tailoring, E-Publishing, AC Mechanic, Nursing Assistant, Beautician, Lab technician Assistant, Electrician, Bakery unit, and Tally.

## 3. Homes for Children

Sevalaya runs Swami Vivekananda Boys home, Mother Teresa Girls Home at Sevalaya's Kasuva centre at Thiruvallur District. We provide education for the children and for all residents, food, clothing, shelter and sanitation.

#### 4. Homes for Senior citizens

Sevalaya runs Sri Ramakrishna Paramahansa old age home at Sevalaya's Kasuva centre at Thiruvallur District. There are three more Old Age Homes at Thanjavur, Dharmapuri and Zamin Endathur (Chengalpet). We provide residents, food, clothing, and shelter.

## 5. Animal Care

Vinobhaji Gaushala is a haven for cows that have out-lived their period of “utility” and will otherwise be destined for the slaughter-house. The Gaushala also shelters milk yielding cows. The milk is consumed by the resident children and elders. We are submitting herewith our proposal to construct MS roof truss shed for gaushala of size 80 x 48 x 11 height to accommodate the 30 cows. The work of a new shed would enhance the capacity of the cow shed from 30 cattle to another 60 cattle.

## 6. Health & well being

Pattinapakkam, is a neighbourhood in Chennai and was the worst affected when tsunami hit the coastal parts of the city. Sevalaya runs a community college in this community largely inhabited by the fishermen community. Recently Sevalaya started a health centre with a full time doctor and a paramedic. The health services are provided free of cost. On an average the footfall in the health centre is 20-25 patients per day. The operational cost for running the health centre is ₹12lakhs.

## 7. Art and culture

Sevalaya is collaborating with the Indian Railways for this project that recalls the two years Bharathi spent in Kadayam. A man far ahead of his times, he faced the wrath of the then traditional society at Kadayam village, and was even excommunicated. It was in this town many of his immortal poems were composed. Around 1,200 Sq feet of wall space at Kilkadayam Railway station will be decorated by the paintings of incidents from the life of Bharathi and Chellamma at Kadayam.
