RNAIPL sponsors Miyawaki project



The inauguration of the Miyawaki Urban Forestry Project at Appur village, sponsored by Renault Nissan Automotive India Private Ltd (RNAIPL) was held on 20th April 2022.

The Chief Guest Biju Balendran, MD

and CEO of Renault Nissan Automotive India Pvt Ltd, said that the mission was to green the environment around the company premises. 500 tree saplings were planted in Appur Village under this project. 50 saplings were distributed to the local villagers and employees of RNAIPL. As a part of community engagement and creating employment opportunities, two locals are employed to maintain the forest by regularly watering the plants and de-weeding.

Miyawaki is a technique pioneered by Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki, that helps build dense, native forests. Miyawaki forests grow in two to three years and are self-sustaining. They help lower temperatures in concrete heat islands, reduce air and noise pollution, attract local birds and insects, and create carbon sinks.

Appur Panchayat President Kumarasamy said it was good to plant 500 saplings in their village and assured full cooperation from the community to maintain the forest.

Bharathi Chellamma journey to Kadayam starts..



Mahakavi Bharathiyar is one of the inspirations of Sevalaya. Statues have been installed and memorials have been established for the great poet in Ettayapuram, Puducherry, Chennai - all places associated with his life. Even in Varanasi, where he spent a few years as a student, a statue of the poet has been installed in his memory. It is very unfortunate that there are no traces of Bharathi in Kadayam, the birthplace of his wife Chellamma. Bharathi married Chellamma at Kadayam village on 27th June 1897. Later, in 1919, when Bharathi was released from Cuddalore jail, he lived in Kadayam for 2 years.

Sevalaya has initiated a project to perpetuate the memory of Mahakavi at Kadayam. As a first step Sevalaya will be installing a life-size statue of Chellamma and Bharathi on 27th June 2022, on the occasion of the 125th wedding anniversary of the poet at Kadayam.

A 7ft tall statue of Bharathi with his hands over the shoulder of Chellamma is ready and had been waiting to go to Kadayam for the past 4 years.

The journey of Bharathi Chellamma towards Kadayam began on 17th April 2022.

The Bharathi Chellamma statue was flagged off from the residence of the sculptor Surendranath after a small function, on 17th April 2022. The statue was placed on a decorated Rath which then proceeded to Sevalaya's Kasuva centre. The Rath Yatra will proceed from Sevalaya's Kasuva centre in Thiruvallur District, going across different districts of State, reaching Kadayam on 1st June 2022.

Uma Bharathi, relative of Mahakavi Bharathi, popular artiste J Jeyaraj, and wood sculptor Appar Lakshmanan were the Chief Guests for the function.

On the occasion of this historic event, various competitions like oratorical, dance and Bharathi poem recitation were held for the students. The winners of the competitions presented their prizewinning performance at the function at Kasuva centre.

Speaking on the occasion, Uma Bharathi said "It was due to the divine grace of Bharathi and Parashakthi Sevalaya Murali could conceive such a huge project and execute it with confidence and determination". She assured her support and also said that she will mobilise support for this project amongst her friends and relatives.

Artiste Jeyaraj offered his felicitations to Sevalaya Murali and the sculptor Surendar.

Wood sculptor Appar Lakshmanan asserted that it is absolutely essential for any artist to internalise the concept which will reflect in his/ her creation. "Unless Surendar has internalised Bharathi, he could not have sculpted this life-like statue with just a photograph of the illustrious couple" he said.

Artist Mari Anand recollected his long association with Sevalaya Murali and thanked him for this great opportunity to



his son Surendranath to create the statue of Bharathi with Chellamma, the only statue as a couple in the whole world.



He was an English man who had perhaps been in South Africa. They were talking of so many things but before Gandhiji could leave for the Court as scheduled at 3 00 PM, the Magistrate had sent him a message that he would not pass orders that day, but fixed the day for it some six days hence.

Gandhiji went back to his residence, where too a large crowd of ryots who awaited his return. About this time, Rajendra Prasad arrived at Champaran. He and his colleagues who arrived with him, communicated their decision to go to jail if and when needed.

Details were worked out. Gandhiji divided the volunteers in to batches of two to carry on the investigation and court imprisonment one after the other.

The idea was that one batch should continue the investigation and when it was imprisoned, the next batch should take its place, and if they could get others to follow, they should also carry on in the same fashion.

Chellamma Bharathi Learning Centre, Kadayam Implemented by - Sevalaya A little later, Gandhiji received a letter from the Magistrate intimating that he had reported the whole matter to the higher authorities, and requesting him not to visit any village till such time as the judgment was delivered. Gandhiji readily acceded to this.

The idea of voluntarily going to jail was a novel one in India. Till Gandhiji came, they would not do anything that would in the ordinary course entail imprisonment. They would do things in such a way as would enable them to avoid going to jail. If they wanted to talk sedition, they would do it, but would think of Sec 124 A of IPC and would use such language as would enable them to keep them out of trouble!

A little later, a formal order arrived and the case was withdrawn. Gandhiji saw the District Manager and was told that he could continue with the enquiry, but he should see that there was no unrest.

The team then began to record formally the statements of the ryots. Gandhiji

had impressed on the team that the statements might be exaggerated and even be false, and as lawyers, they should use their legal acumen and take them down after fully testing them.

A large number of ryots turned everyday, and in spite of working from early morning till evening, they could not complete the work. During the enquiry, Police officials were being present and observing the proceedings. This irritated the lawyers and complained to Gandhiji.

But, Gandhiji chided them saying that they were objecting to the Police presence just because there was the fear of the Police in their heart and that they should the fear and drive out the fear from the hearts of the ryots also. They should state whatever they had to say boldly and fearlessly in the presence of the Police, Magistrate or the planters.
