was born in Tirupati on March 2, 1982,
to Muralidharan and Uma, and raised in
Chennai. He has an elder brother Rajesh.
His hero from childhood to this day is
Lord Shri Hanuman and he is inspired
by the works of Shri Yogananda, and his
favourite sportsmen are Rahul Dravid
(cricket) and Rafael Nadal (tennis).

Following conventional advice, he joined the Chartered Accountancy course in India while pursuing a B.Com at D G Vaishnav College. Soon, he realised his

From Rural Roots to Police

K Prabhakaran was born in Ambattur and later moved to Ramanathapuram village in Tiruvallur district. His father, D Kannan, is a daily wage labourer, and his mother, Vasanthi, is a homemaker. Prabhakaran joined Sevalaya's Mahakavi Bharathiyar Higher Secondary School in VII Std where he continued his education till Std XII.

He fondly recalls his school life as the best



aspirations were more global. Wriggling out of a ₹485 monthly articleship stipend, he shifted focus to public accounting and identified the US Certified Public Accountant (CPA) qualification as a better match.

In 2010, Deloitte sponsored his initial US CPA exam trip, but his final attempt in 2011 required about USD 3,000 — far beyond his minimal savings while raising a young family in Hyderabad. Taking a personal loan, despite his wife's concerns, he saw it as an investment in long-term benefits. In May 2013, he proudly earned the CPA designation, leading to a role with Grant Thornton in Chicago, USA. In 2020, he added Canadian CPA to his credentials.

Career milestones include two years at Ernst & Young in Bangalore, setting up

KPMG's Audit Quality practice in Bahrain, and joining KPMG Global in 2022. His journey has taken him through Chennai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Chicago, Bahrain, and now Toronto, Canada.

Entrepreneurial at heart, Athreya founded Audimatiq Consulting, Inc., helping CPA/CA firms design effective quality management systems with innovative technology. He partners with CPA Ontario to develop Canadian CPA learning content and with Simandhar Education as CPA audit faculty, while authoring thought leadership.

Married to Preetha, they have two sons

— Vishvareth, a passionate tennis player, and Trayaksh, an exceptional Lego builder. Chess is a family favourite, often sparking playful debates over the best player.

Athreya first connected with Murali via LinkedIn and was inspired by his bold decision to leave a successful corporate career for social entrepreneurship, fully dedicated to Sevalaya's vision.
Calling it "a leap of faith" and "an act of God," Athreya admired the selflessness behind Murali's work. Determined to lead by example for his sons, he began contributing to Sevalaya monthly, believing that generosity should become a habit before success brings ego or complacency.

The role of Mahadev Desai in the Salt Satyagraha was significant, as an active participant, as a guide and motivator of the workers, and as an accurate chronicler

In a meeting at Ahmedabad, Mahadev spoke:

"This is a battle between the Gods and the devils. The Government is positively devilish; but we have also to fight the demon within us. It was the police who irritated, excited the people and instigated them in Calcutta. But the people in Calcutta that started the riots, hurt other people, and burnt the trams, were our own people. And, since we have joined this sacred struggle, we are pledged not to harm Indians or Europeans, and so such incidents should make us feel ashamed.

We have seen that Mahadev was arrested on 23rd April 1930. He had described his arrest and his mind in a very effective style.

He wrote: There is no "supreme happiness" today in going to jail, because jail contains no longer the purifying flames. The purifying flames are burning outside. The people in jail are the observers, enjoying themselves. Those people working outside the prison, preparing to burn themselves out in the purifying flames are really those 'inside' and now, I do not have the chance of that "supreme happiness" and I am hurt that I have only to see and suffer in jail.

When Mahadev was taken from the court to jail, the crowd of people wanted to garland Mahadev. The white sergeant dove off the prison van disregarding the people. Because of that, some impulsive person threw a stone which hurt the sergeant's chin. He started abusing. Mahadev expressed his regret in a sorrowful voice, but that man's abuses continued. So Mahadev said, "You hit me with that stone, or give it to me. I would hit me with it, if it quietens you."


He understood Mahadev's satyagrahi's attitude and started talking about other things. When the prison van was passing the Ashram, Mahadev invited him to come to the Ashram and asked his name. The sergeant asked for a pen to write his name. Just then they reached the gates of the jail. The sergeant was returning the pen, when Mahadev insisted on his keeping it as a memento of the incident and asked for the stone, and throwing it

out said, "With this please throw away the bitter memories of the incident." The sergeant smiled and aid, "That has been already forgotten."

An incident that occurred before Mahadev was arrested is worth mentioning. A revolutionary organisation suspended its activities for five years, to observe the result of the non-violent movements

In a letter to Mahadev, "The Awakened Revolutionary Association" stated that they had decided to suspend the movement for India's freedom for five years from 6th April 1930, to observe the result of the non-violent movements. They had specifically requested Mahadev to inform Gandhiji about it.
