# A Different Kind of Auditor

"An average student, but exceptionally creative", by his own description, Balaji M Athreya was a high energy kid and multi-talented. A student of Chinmaya Vidyalaya School, Kilpauk, he was into painting, arts and sports winning in many interschool contests. He was the school cricket captain and by a whisker, missed attending the Republic Day parade in Delhi, after going through five rigorous camps on his way to becoming a Company Sergeant Major (CSM) representing the Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry, Andaman & Nicobar contingent.

Hailing from a humble Tamil family,
Athreya - as he's more popularly called,
was born in Tirupati on 2 Mar 1982, to
Muralidharan and Uma, and raised in
Chennai. He has an elder brother Rajesh.
His hero from childhood to this day is
Lord Shri Hanuman and he's inspired by
the works of Shri Yogananda, and his
favourite sportsmen are Rahul Dravid
(cricket) and Rafael Nadal (tennis).

Following conventional advice, he joined the CA course in India while pursuing a B.Com at D G Vaishnav College. Soon, he realised his aspirations were more



global. Wriggling out of a ₹485 monthly articleship stipend, he shifted focus to public accounting and identified the US Certified Public Accountant (CPA) qualification as a better match.

In 2011, Deloitte sponsored his initial US CPA exam trip, but his final attempt in 2013 required about USD 3,000 - far beyond his minimal savings while raising a young family in Hyderabad. Taking a personal loan, despite his wife's concerns, he saw it as an investment in long-term benefits. In May 2013, he proudly earned the CPA designation, leading to a role with Grant Thornton in Chicago, USA. In 2020, he added Canadian CPA to his credentials.

Career milestones include two years at EY in Bangalore, setting up KPMG's Audit Quality practice in Bahrain, and joining KPMG Global in 2022. His journey has taken him through Chennai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Chicago, Bahrain, and now Toronto, Canada.

Entrepreneurial at heart, Athreya founded Audimatiq Consulting, Inc., helping CPA/CA firms design effective quality management systems with innovative technology. He partners with CPA Ontario to develop Canadian CPA learning content and with Simandhar Education as CPA audit faculty, while authoring thought leadership.

Married to Preetha, they have two sons - Vishvareth, a passionate tennis player, and Trayaksh, an exceptional Lego builder. Chess is a family favourite, often sparking playful debates over the best player.

Athreva first connected with Murali via LinkedIn and was inspired by his bold decision to leave a successful corporate career for social entrepreneurship, fully dedicated to Sevalaya's vision. Calling it "a leap of faith" and "an act of God," Athreya admired the selflessness behind Murali's work. Determined to lead by example for his sons, he began contributing to Sevalaya monthly, believing that generosity should become a habit before success brings ego or complacency. Sevalaya often features in their family conversations, shaping values as he and his wife Preetha look ahead to their later years.

Guided by his favourite Sanskrit quotes - "As you think, so you become" and "Let noble thoughts come to us from everywhere" - the Athreya family plans to visit Sevalaya's Chennai campus in August 2026.

Her true inspiration to pursue social work, however, began in her college environment at the Madras School of Social Work. Interacting with students from other departments exposed her to the various dimensions of the field. Attending a conference at NIMHANS (National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences) further introduced her to community development initiatives and the impactful role of social workers, which deeply inspired her to explore this profession with purpose.

Her mother, Manimegalai, runs a franchise business of a fast food shop at Tiruvallur. Deetchana studied Std X

at SRMJV School, and completed Std XI and XII at Sri Niketan Higher Secondary School, Tiruvallur. She pursued her undergraduate degree in Psychology at the Madras School of Social Work, where she is currently in her II year of postgraduation in Social Work.

Her volunteering journey began with an introduction to the campus and overall functioning of Sevalaya through an orientation video and a campus visit. She initially assisted with data entry at Sevalaya's medical centre - entering patient data from health camps. Soon after, she started engaging deeply with students at the hostel, conducting

psychology-based activities that helped them explore their goals, overcome fears, build self-esteem, and reflect on their strengths. She also facilitated interactive sessions for senior citizens, including brain games like puzzles and spot-thedifference activities, bringing joy and mental stimulation to their daily lives.

Her hobbies include drawing, painting, engaging in craft works, organising things, and reading books. She is passionate about contributing towards women empowerment and aims to create a positive impact by making a meaningful difference in the lives of women through her future social work journey.

## Mahadev Desai - 26

On his way back from England to India, Gandhiji decided to go via Switzerland, though it meant delay in reaching India. This was particularly for the purpose of meeting Romain Rolland whom Gandhiji considered as a saint. For Mahadev, it was a unique opportunity to witness the meeting of two ascetics – one from the East and the other from the West. Romain Rolland was living in a small village in Switzerland, named Villeneuve. It was on 6th December 1931, the historic meet took place at the village.

Mahadev wrote:" Thus, on the very first day, opening up his heart, pushing back his chair, Rolland took Gandhiji's hands in his own hands and keenly gazed at him, like a lover gazing at a longlost beloved." Romain Rolland's sister Madeleine acted as the interpreter. She said, "We never thought that such a day will come. We often feared that would we have to leave this world without meeting you?"

Romain Rolland's entry in his diary of 9th December gives a fairly good description of Rolland's impression on Mahadev.


"In the evening, I had another

conversation, short but pleasant, with Gandhiji's first Secretary Mahadev Desai, a handsome Indian, 35 to 40, tall, well-built with an intelligent face. My sister has had longer conversations with him, and I know that he left his career as a lawyer to devote himself entirely to Gandhiji, which brought him a never-failing happiness. But I do know from Mira, and he tells me himself this evening, that my writings and thoughts have their place in his life. He was delighted when Mira came to the Ashram, as they would talk together about me, and Desai asked Mira to teach him French, so that he could read my words in the original. But when Gandhiji heard about it, he reproached both of them severely, saying quite rightly, that at a time like the present, they should not be reading works of art, but devoting themselves entirely to the cause of India.

This did not stop Desai from continuing his studies, as he tells me, he now knows enough French to realise how often the English translations are unfaithful to my text. He asks me to give Jean Christophe in French, as well as my Vie de Tolstoi; he hopes that he will soon be sent to prison, back in India, which will give him time to read my books. The emotion in his eyes and his Indian gesture of devotion tells me of the affectionate gratitude he feels towards me. He and Pyarelal have been longing for this meeting for years, twice already it should have happened and it fell through; he says that it feels now like a dream. Everyone works to exhaustion in Gandhi's circle. When the master himself has gone to bed, Desai and Pyarelal very often stay up late at night making fair copies of notes taken during the day.

Desai has the job of editing them for publication in Young India."
