Srinivasan was born in 1967 in Chinnalapatti, a small village near Dindigul, Tamil Nadu, which is famous for its handloom silk sarees. He completed his schooling in his native village before pursuing a Bachelor of Engineering in Electronics and Communication at the College of Engineering, Guindy, under Anna University, graduating in 1988. His father who was a Secondary Grade Headmaster at the Government Aided School at Chinnalapatti, and his mother, Saroja, served as a Village Health Nurse, supporting primary healthcare, maternal care and child vaccination programmes. He also has two sisters, who are married and settled in Chennai.

After completing his degree, he was selected through campus recruitment by CMC Ltd. and was posted in Hyderabad. He spent four years managing government data centres that supported

several important projects, including India's space programme under ISRO.

He then moved to Doha, Qatar, where he worked for one of the largest computer services companies for 12 years. In 2005, he returned to Chennai and held senior positions at HCL, UST Global, and Technosoft before joining Aspire Systems.

Srinivasan is currently the Vice President, Infrastructure and Application Services Business Unit at Aspire Systems, Siruseri. He leads a team of around 500 technical professionals and works with customers across the globe. He frequently travels overseas to meet clients and develop new business opportunities.

He is married to Dr Devasena, currently a homemaker who practised as doctor at VHS Hospital, Guindy. They have a son, Karthi, who is pursuing his Ph.D. at Yale

University in the United States.

An avid traveller, Srinivasan enjoys visiting forests, wildlife sanctuaries and other places close to nature. He likes meeting people, learning about different cultures and capturing beautiful moments through photography. Reading, kayaking and recently learning the violin are among his favourite hobbies.

One of his most memorable experiences was during an official visit to the United States, when he accidentally lost his wedding ring in a shopping mall. To his surprise and delight, it was found and returned to him four days later, leaving him with a lasting memory of honesty and kindness.

Having grown up in a village known for its handloom silk sarees, he strongly believes in preserving India's rich handloom heritage.

S Santhi – A Journey of dedication & growth



Santhi was born in Tiruttani into a family with six daughters. Her father, Sivalingam, worked at the Tiruttani Devasthanam, while her mother was the backbone of the family, raising the children with strong values especially hardwork, dedication and effective task management. She completed her schooling up to Std XII at Government Girls Higher Secondary School, Tiruttani.

During her childhood, she learnt the importance of compassion and responsibility. She remembers collecting

the discarded tops of sugarcane from the local market and feeding them to the family's ten cows instead of letting them go to waste. As four of her sisters got married, her family also planned her marriage. However, Santhi was determined to continue her education. She scored 422/500 in Std X and 900/1200 in Std XII. Her dream of becoming a teacher encouraged her to move to Chennai and join the Teachers Training course at Poonamallee, breaking the barrier of higher education in her

family.

After completing her training, she began her career as a Montessori teacher at Sudandira Matriculation School. At the age of 21, she married Karmegam, proprietor of Kalki Traders, an insecticide business. Later, while working at a school in Tiruvallur, her colleague Ms. Divya introduced her to Sevalaya. Her experience in teaching at a private School in Tiruvallur helped her develop

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classroom management skills, handle teaching materials, conduct group presentations, and make lessons engaging through real-life examples.

In June 2011, she joined Sevalaya as a Montessori teacher, caring for nearly 300 young children. After taking maternity leave, she rejoined the organisation in 2013 with the same passion. Her patience, dedication, and leadership led to her promotion to Assistant Headmistress of the Primary Section.

Sevalaya also supported her professional growth by sponsoring her B Ed. She credits the organisation for helping her build confidence, strengthen her leadership and team management skills, and improve her computer knowledge as she took on greater responsibilities.

Beyond teaching, Santhi has played an active role in organising exhibitions, convocations, cultural programmes, and other school events. She expresses her sincere gratitude to R Vijaya, Head of Education, for trusting her abilities

Dengue awareness programme

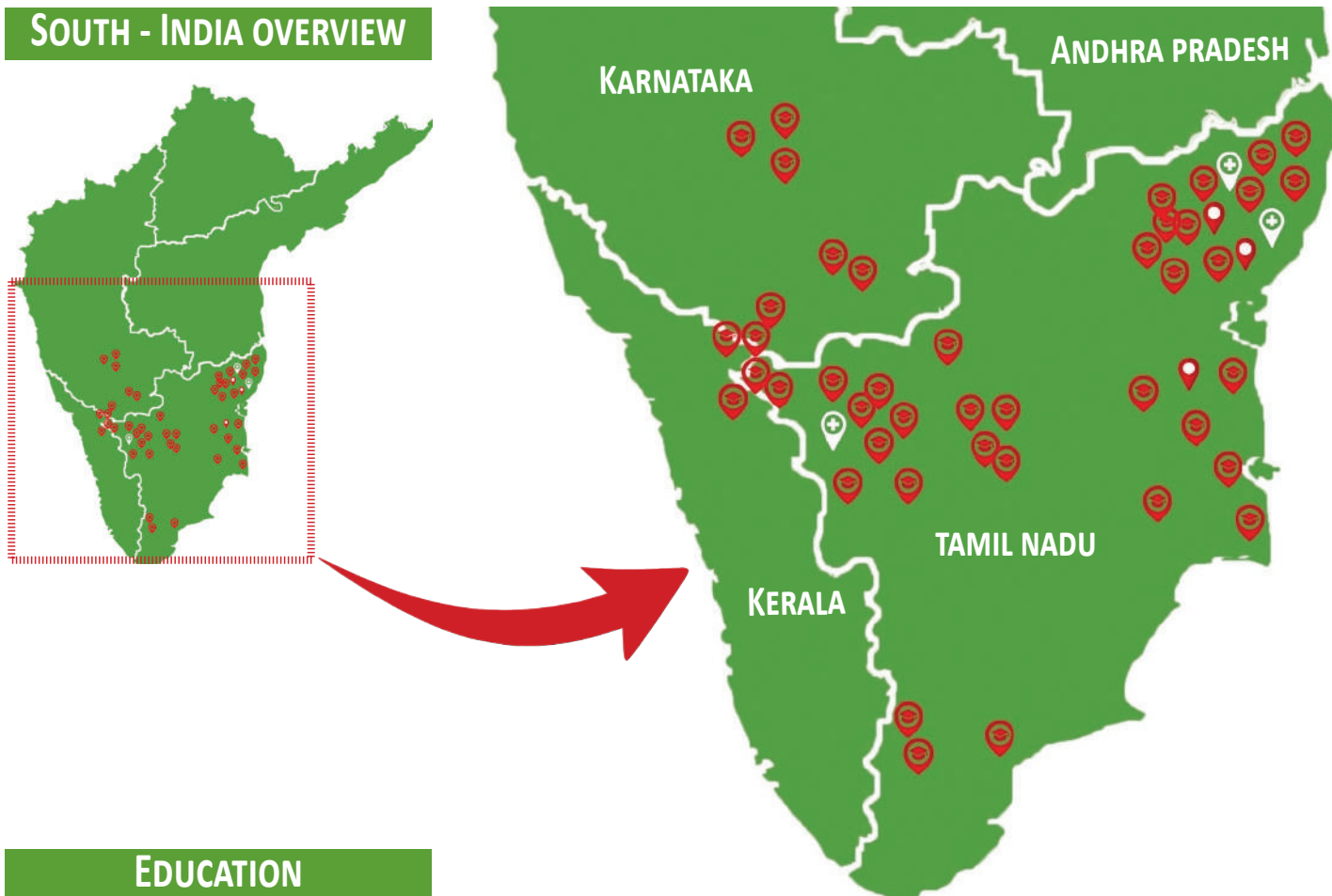

Mahadev's main work of portraying Gandhiji before Gandhiji continued unabated.

Some excerpts from Dr Dodd's interview with Gandhiji has been recorded by Mahadev. Dr Dodd was the President of a college for women barristers.

Q: What is your main objective Mr Gandhi?

A: The main objective is obvious and it is to gain independence – not for the literate and the rich in India – but for the dumb millions.

Q: ... And what are your methods?

A: Not many methods – but the one method of unadulterated truth and non-violence...The central fact in my programme is the spinning wheel.

Q: Your spinning programme is to fight the unemployment. But with you, Mr Gandhi, it is a moral and a spiritual symbol too?

A: Yes, of truth and non- violence. When as a nation we adopt the spinning wheel, we not only solve the question of unemployment but we declare that we

have no intention of exploiting any nation and we also end the exploitation of the poor by the rich – You too have got the unemployment problem, but it is of your own creation. Our unemployment is not entirely of our creation.

Q: Mr Gandhi, I should like you to tell me what you consider your most satisfactory achievement.. What should I put before the young people as a theory they should aspire after in life?

A: I may say that in the midst of humiliation and so called defeat and a tempestuous life, I am able to retain my peace, because of an undying faith in God, translated as truth.

Q: What Mr Gandhi has been your greatest disappointment?

A: Frankly, I have no sense of disappointment, excepting perhaps that sometimes I am disappointed with myself, in as much as I cannot control the fleeting thoughts as much as I should like to.

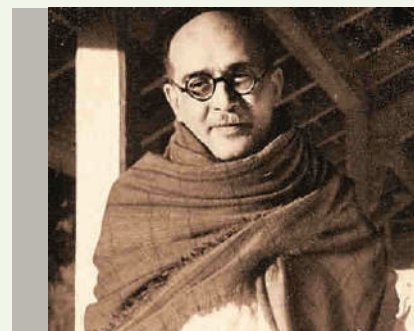
Q: What is the source of your ideals?

A: The source is truth or the uttermost identity with all life.

In a number of places in Mahadev's diaries. There are quite a few incidents, important and unimportant, which enlightens the reader. His humour was ever present. In his style we find both detail and brevity and when required. How ingenious are the two lines written about Hindi poet Sivaram Sharma Gupta! "There was no end to his humility. I had gone to receive him in the station. He prostrated himself before me right there on the platform. Or this sentence of Gandhiji – "I am alert even when I am asleep; my sleep is not oblivion; it is refreshing."

He wrote to an American, "There is no limit to love. My nationalism includes all the countries of the world, without any thought about religion or ideology."
